The Champion of Champions Meet

From 1956 to 1972, the Champion of Champions meet at Kalamazoo College's Angell Field brought together much of the state's best track & field talent, including many of the state champions during that period. Kalamazoo Central coach Elf Pedler led the committee that drew up the plans for the first edition. The meet was also championed by WMU coach George Dales.



track and field meet here May 30, bringing together the top high school performers from all parts of the state.

The meet, according to the original proposal, would offer "a look at the eight best Michigan prep athletes in every event competing against each other In a real champion of champions showdown. Invitations will be tendered on the basis of performances in the regional and state finals." The original selection committee was Dales and a local sportswriter, Jack Moss.

In 1964, for instance, all state champions were automatically invited, in addition to athletes who made the following standards could apply for an invitation: 10.0, 21.9, 505, 1:58.0, 4:30.0, 14.8, 19.8, 6-2, 12-6, 22-0, 53-0.

Athletes of all grades and school sizes were included. The event also originally featured exhibition races featuring some top Olympic athletes, as well as junior high events.

The MHSAA gave the event its full support. Athletes were allowed to wear school uniforms and the relays featured school teams. Charles E. Forsythe, the director of the MHSAA, was the honorary referee of the first edition.

The event was sponsored for many of its years by the Kalamazoo Jaycees and the Kalamazoo Gazette and was originally a fundraiser for the Olympic Fund, which support the U.S. Olympic teams.

The quality of the meet was undeniable. The fields usually featured most of the best in the state, with the notable exception of the Detroit schools. Scheduled for a week after the state finals, it clashed with the Detroit PSL Championships, which were also held after the state finals. It wasn't until the final edition that a Detroit athlete won at Waldo Stadium.

Over the years, crowds of often up to 2500 came out to see state champions in various classes do battle. However, in 1973, the event was finally cancelled. The Gazette reported it was "a victim of who was going to stage the big show." Another report noted that organizers had experienced difficulty in getting the top stars to attend in the latter years.

The next year, the Midwest Meet of Champions was created to fill the void, an event for where the top seniors from various Midwest states competed against each other.

Year-by-Year Highlights

1956: John Palmer of St. Louis won the outstanding performer award after winning the low hurdles into a headwind, tying for 1st in the shot, and taking 3rd in both the long jump and high hurdles. Overall, Class B athletes won 10 events to the 7 won by Class A athletes. An exhibition featuring some of the best collegiate milers in the state saw WMU's Bill Pyle win in 4:20.4.

1957: Bob Jones of Battle Creek captured the 100/200 double and was voted the outstanding athlete. Olympic relay gold medalist Ira Murchison set a track record of 9.6 in winning the exhibition 100-yard dash.

1958: Farmington's Rex Cawley, who 6 years later would be a World Record holder and Olympic champion, was voted outstanding athlete after winning both hurdle races in meet records in a light drizzle. Pontiac won the 3-lap medley relay (then a feature of the state finals instead of the mile relay) in 2:27.8, a state record.

1959: Terrible weather cut the crowd size by more than half as only 900 showed. A blackout was caused by storms, so the meet "was conducted in semi-darkness" for 35 minutes. For the second-straight year, Rex Cawley stole the headlines. On his way to a top 10 World Ranking as a high school senior in both the 120 highs and the 400 hurdles, he won both prep hurdle events in record times, and added a 21.4 anchor on Farmington's winning 4x2.

1960: In front of a crowd of 2500, Mack Hunter of Muskegon Heights captured the spotlight. The sprinter, who missed regionals and the state finals with an ankle injury, took on the Class A state champ Maurice Pea of Flint Northern and won both the 100 (9.8) and 220 (21.4) in record times.

1961: Bradell Pritchett of Pontiac Central threw a state record of 61-3.5 in front of 2500 fans to earn outstanding athlete honors. The other big star was Neil Browne of Class D Lawton, who defeated the stars from bigger schools to win the mile in 4:28.9. Ira Murchison returned from injury to win the exhibition 100 in 9.7.

1962: Joe Parham set records in the sprints (9.8, 21.6) and anchored Muskegon Heights to a record 1:30.0 in the 4 x 2 to earn outstanding athlete honors. Jerry Cerulla of Wyandotte Roosevelt captured both hurdle races. In exhibition races, Olympic bronze medalist (and later a gold winner) Hayes Jones ran 14.0 for the hurdles; Ira Murchison took the 100 in 9.8 two days after winning the Michigan AAU title.

1963: Walt Wilson of Robichaud High took down the meet record in the 880 with his 1:54.7 and also anchored the winning mile relay to win outstanding athlete honors. Many were excited when a pair of Class D jumpers tied at a record 6-5 in the high jump: Mike Bowers (Litchfield) and Charles Washington (Centreville). The exhibition races were called off when the stars couldn't make it; they wouldn't be on the schedule again.

1964: The meet moved to Western Michigan's Waldo Stadium. Jim Giachino from Kalamazoo's University High thrilled the locals among the 1000 fans with his record win in the mile at 4:20.1. That got him outstanding athlete honors. Roseville produced possibly the best mark with a state record 3:22.0 mile relay that was more than 6 seconds faster than the winning time at the Class A state finals. Sophomore Delbert Littlejohn became the second champion from that family, soaring over 6-5.25 in the high jump (in the days before the Fosbury Flop).

1965: The chilly, windy weather limited the crowd to just 400 spectators as Flint Central junior Len Hatchett earned outstanding athlete honors with his hurdle double and his leg on the 4x2 winners. Kerchival Patterson of Ypsilanti won the sprint double (9.9 / 22.0) and Manchester's Gary Knickerbocker tied the meet record in the high jump (6-5.25).

1966: Pontiac Central's Bill Tipton, on his way to becoming the No. 1 hurdler in the country, stole the spotlight with two record-breaking runs, 14.2 in the highs and a state record 18.9 in the lows. Over 1000 fans applauded. They also saw Rich Stevens of Dearborn Heights Riverside blast a 1:53.7 in the

880, then anchor the winning mile relay in 49.2. Future MSU great Bill Wehrwein of Roseville beat the meet record in the 440 with his 49.4.

1967: Junior Gary Van Elst of Middleville's Thornapple-Kellogg High won meet honors when he crushed the state record in the shot put in a thrilling dual with East Detroit's Giulio Catallo. Van Elst had to break the state record to win, as Catallo had already broken it three (!) times that day, with throws of 62-2.5, 62-8.5 and 63-2.5. The only double winner of the day was sprinter John Schneider of Marshall (9.8w / 22.7 in "brisk" weather). As at the MHSAA finals, the two-mile was added to the meet, with Southfield's Kim Hartman winning the first title in 9:37.8.

1968: Ron DeVries of Class B Erie-Mason became one of the best stories in the meet's history. The 6-2.5 senior came in with a high jump PR of 6-5. He had won the B title at 6-3 in a season where he had been spending a lot of time pole vault and the hurdles. For the week before Champ of Champs, he had concentrated only on the high jump, and his coach Jerry Wing predicted he could go 6-7. Instead, he flew over a state record 6-9.25, defeating the best jumpers in the state. In other events, Kalamazoo Central broke its own meet record in the 4 x 2 at 1:29.3, and Andy Johnson of Battle Creek Central won both hurdle races.

1969: John Morrison, a hurdler from Redford Union (and later coach at Brighton), won outstanding athlete honors on a warm, sunny day with a snappy hurdle double of 14.0 / 19.1, the highs mark being a meet record. Southgate became the first team in state history to crack 3:20 in the mile relay with its 3:19.7. Class C Reading High surprised many by beating the Class A powers to take the 4 x 2 relay.

1970: Benton Harbor's Rod Rhodes won top honors with a blazing sprint double (9.7 MR / 21.6) plus anchor on a winning 4x2. Rob Cassleman of Grand Rapids Catholic Central crushed the 400 record with his 48.6 and Muskegon Catholic's Jim Stevenson became the first vaulter in meet history to top 14-feet.

1971: St. Joseph runners won both the mile and two mile in 80° heat, with Tim Tobin taking outstanding athlete honors with his 4:16.8 record performance over four laps. Teammate Steve Norris broke the meet record in the two-mile at 9:19.7. Bob Eubank of Grand Rapids Union won a sprint double (10.2 / 22.0).

1972: No one knew it at the time, but it was the last edition of the meet. The portents were there: at a new site (Kalamazoo Central), the always impeccably-run meet started over an hour late, and some of the key entrants did not show. Only 300 fans watched, as temperatures climbed above 80° on a sunny afternoon. Whomever won the outstanding athlete award is lost to history, though it was probably Ken Delor, winner of the 100 (meet record 9.6) and 220 (21.9). Mike Burns of Carson City-Crystal, later to be the head timer at the state cross country finals, broke the mile record with his 4:14.5.
