

Winners in the Star Athletic Club's Games Yesterday.

The Star athletic club had their field day games yesterday at the Detroit athletic club's grounds. The membership of the Star club is composed of boys, and none of those who contested were over 17 years old, ranging from that age down to 13 years. There were 15 events on the program. The contestants and winners in the different events were as follows:

100-yards dash—Four ran in the first heat, Harold Wetmore at scratch, Smith Fish four yards, Fred Heyerman and George Hendrie each five yards. Wetmore won in 12 2-5 seconds, Heyerman second. In the second heat, between Walter Gorman at scratch, Joe Colt at two yards and Ben Fish at three yards, Gorman and Colt ran a dead heat in 12 3/4. The final heat was won by Wetmore in 12 1-5, Heyerman second.

Standing broad jump—Harold Wetmore and Louis Nall jumped at scratch, Sidney Joy at four inches, Fred W. Wolmilch at six inches and Gus Ledyard at nine inches. Wolmilch won, 7 feet 7 1/2 inches, Jay second, 7 feet 6 inches.

Running high jump—Tryon Gorman at scratch, Louis Nall one inch, Joe Colt, two inches. Nall won, 4 feet 6 inches; Gorman second, 4 feet, 4 inches.

Hop, step and jump—Tryon Gorman scratch, Harold Wetmore 10 inches, Kearsley Sterling 3 feet 2 inches, Ben Fish and Geo. Hendrie each 3 feet 6 inches. Gorman won, 32 feet 11 inches; Sterling second, 31 feet 9 inches; Fish third.

220 yards dash—Harold Wetmore scratch, Walter Gorman two yards, Geo. Hendrie and Fred Heyerman each 11 yards, Kearsley Sterling 13 yards. Gorman won in 28 2-5, Sterling second, Heyerman third.

Putting 12-pound shot—Harold Wetmore scratch, Sidney Joy and Maurice McMillan each 5 feet 10 inches. Joy won, 36 feet 1 inch; Wetmore second, 30 feet 8 1/2 inches.

440 yards' dash—Henry Keep and Herbert Quinby scratch, Walter Gorman 10 yards, Joe Colt 14 yards, Fred Wolmilch 16 yards, Walter Joy 26 yards, Kearsley Sterling and George Hendrie each 27 yards. Wolmilch won, 1:04 4-5, Sterling second.

Running long jump—Harold Wetmore, Tryon Gorman and Louis Nall scratch, Gus Ledyard one foot, and Edward Sumner and Sidney Joy each one foot five inches. Gorman won, 14 feet 8 1/2 inches, Sumner second, 14 feet 3 inches, Wetmore third.

One mile run—Henry Keep and Herbert Quinby scratch, Fred Balch 16 yards, Fred Wolmilch 17 yards. Balch won, 6:52, Wolmilch second, 7:13 4-5, Quinby third.

120 yard hurdle—The first heat between Joe Colt at scratch, Walter Joy 2 yards and Edward Sumner 10 yards, was won by Joy, Colt second. The second heat between Tryon Gorman at scratch, George Hendrie and Fred Heyerman 10 yards, was won by Gorman. Gorman won the final heat in 21 1/2, Joy second, Hendrie third.

880-yard run—Fred Wolmilch 20 yards, Walter Gorman 18 yards, Walter Joy 30 yards, and Kearsley Sterling 35 yards. Sterling won in 2:37, Gorman second, Wolmilch third.

The one mile relay race between the black and red teams was won by the blacks, the latter being Henry Keep, Tryon Gorman, Harold Wetmore and Kearsley Sterling, and the reds, Herbert Quinby, Walter Gorman, Fred Balch and Walter Joy, each one of the teams running a quarter of a mile.
