

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS.

Interesting Sport At the Fountain Street Grounds This Morning.

The High School Athletic club had their second semi-annual field day this morning at the Fountain street ball park. The sports commenced at 9:30 o'clock. The first on the programme was a 100 yard dash in which there were four contestants. The first prize, a silver cup, was won by Fred Bradfield, completing it in 12 1-5 seconds; second prize won by Slayton in 12 3-5 seconds.

Next was throwing the ball. Mr. F. Bowen won a flannel shirt by throwing it 235 1-5 feet.

Putting the shot was won by Ray Coffin, putting it 27 feet 8 inches. A flesh brush was the prize.

The three-legged race consisted of three teams, R. Crosby and J. Wright covering 100 yards in 15 seconds.

Fred Bradfield won the standing high jump, by jumping 4 feet 7 inches. Prize a pair of wading boots.

Standing broad jump was won by F. Bowen jumping 9 feet 2 inches. Prize, a pair of dumb bells.

The 2:20 yard dash was won by Bradfield, completing in 33 seconds.

Ray Coffin won the running high jump by jumping 5 feet 2 inches.

Running broad jump was won by Fred Clark by jumping 14 feet 6 1/2 inches.

In the four mile race there were three contestants. The prize was a gold medal which was won by Stewart White, who made the distance in 23 minutes and 17 seconds.

Frank Cutler won the one mile race by completing in 6 minutes 28 2-5 seconds.

The hop, step, jump was won by Ray Coffin, jumping 27 feet 6 1/2 inches. Prize, a silver pin.

The sack race was won by George Widdcomb, covering 50 yards in 18 seconds.

The sport ended in a tug of war. There were four on a side. The winning team were S. Wilcott, E. Stuart, R. Coffin and F. Clark.

The judges were R. Hoyt, J. Hulst and M. Walsh. Frank Bowen acted as time-keeper.
