

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS.

Annual Field Day Exercises Yesterday Afternoon.

The Detroit high school athletic association's annual field day games at the D. A. C. grounds yesterday afternoon drew a good crowd. Some fair time was made in the contests, considering the fact that a stiff wind was blowing down the track in the face of the runners in the dashes and hurdles. Frank S. Werneken was referee. The winners in the contests were as follows:

100 yard dash—First heat, F. C. Thrall, 5½ yards, won; D. Beack, 1½ feet, second; time 11 second. Second heat, E. S. Robinson, 1 foot, first; H. Keep, 3 yards, second; time 11 2-5 seconds. Third heat, F. Field, 7 yards, first; Theo Luce, Jr., scratch second; time 11 2-5 seconds. Fourth heat, W. R. Frazer, scratch first; J. Marker, 3½ yards, second; time 11 1-5 seconds. Fifth heat, W. Bernard, 1 yard, first; James A. Guinness, 5 yards, second; time 11 1-5. The winners of the five trials, Field, Thrall, Robinson, Frazer and Marker, ran in the final. Field won in 11 seconds, Thrall second.

880 yard run—The starters were E. J. Ryan, scratch, E. L. Warner and Frank Chamberlain 20 yards, E. K. Sterling, 40 yards. Ryan won easily in 14. Warner, second; Chamberlain, third.

220-yard hurdle—Three started, Theodore Luce, Jr., scratch; W. R. Frazer, scratch; Robert Wagner, 10 yards. Luce won in 28 2-5 seconds; Frazer, second.

One mile run—Starters, G. A. Courtney, scratch; H. Allen, 35 yards; W. H. Gage 35 yards and W. H. Thorpe, 30 yards. Courtney won 5.11 1-5; Gage, second.

Standing high jump—The contest was between A. Gage, 1½ inches; F. C. Thrall 1½ inches; H. O. Palmer. Thrall won, clearing the bar at 4 feet 2½ inches; Gage, second, 4 feet 1½ inches; Harford, third.

220-yard dash—The starters were F. C. Thrall, 5 yards; F. Werbach, 2 yards; D. Beath, 1 yard; E. S. Robinson, 1 yard. Thrall won in 26 seconds, Robinson second.

One mile bicycle race—The starters were Walter Thompson, scratch; D. M. Ferry, Jr., 15 yards; F. A. Balch, 20 yards. Balch won in 8 minutes, 50 seconds; Thompson second.

Quarter-mile walk—E. J. Ryan, scratch; K. B. Alexander, 12 yards; H. S. Robinson, 10 yards, F. C. Thrall, 10 yards; started. Ryan won in 1 minute 40 seconds; Alexander second.

Standing broad jump—James A. Guinness with a handicap of 10 inches won, his actual jump being 9 feet 2½ inches; H. O. Harford, second, handicap 7 inches, actual jump 9 feet; Robert Wagner, third, handicap 12 inches, actual jump 8 feet 10½ inches.

Half mile safety bicycle—The starters were A. H. Zacharias, 10 yards; Kent Austin, scratch; D. M. Ferry, Jr., 10 yards. Zacharias won in 1 minute 50 seconds; Austin second.

440 yard run—The starters were E. L. Warner, scratch; F. Werbach, 5 yards; Charles Foster, 5 yards; W. H. Gage, 10 yards. Werbach won in 59 seconds; Foster second.

Running broad jump—Theodore Luce, Jr., with a handicap of 6 inches, won, making 18 ft. 4½ in.; W. R. Frazer, handicap 6 inches, 17 ft. 10 in.; H. Keeps, handicap 10 inches, 16 ft. 8½ in. Pole vault—Theodore Luce, Jr., won, clearing the bar at 10 feet; E. L. Warner second, 8 ft. 10 in.

Blake & Campbell's whippets were sent on exhibition dashes at 100 and 200 yards at intervals during the games.
