

**Indoor Meet—Y. M. C. A.**

The entertainment given by members of the Y. M. C. A., at the rink, last Wednesday evening, was exceedingly entertaining. It was styled an "indoor meet," and was a great success, so far as the association was concerned. The program commenced with a grand march, and the various movements were very well executed.

Six hurdles were then set up on the floor, and Messrs. Potter, Smith, Haley and Maiden contested. Potter and Smith cleared the last hurdle at the same time, but Smith was declared the winner as he had cleared all the hurdles without disturbing a bar.

Putting the shot was the next. The ball weighs 16 pounds. The distance the ball was thrown by the contestants was as follows: Potter 25 feet 5 inches, Smith 28 feet 2 inches, Richardson 27 feet 10 inches, Parks 29 feet 9 inches, Alpena 21 feet 4 inches.

The Indian club swinging to music, by Messrs. Oulette, Parks, Potter, Prince, Warner, Smith, Collins, Myers and Kellogg, was beautifully done and well worth seeing.

An exhibition on the parallel bars was then given by Messrs. Jones, Kellogg, Walker, Deadman, Secrist, Windross, Leavitt and Oliver.

The running high jump caused much interest. The contestants were Messrs. Potter, Oulette, Maiden, Collins, Parks, Cavanagh and Richardson. At a height of 4 feet 7 inches the ranks began to thin out and when the bar had been raised to 4 feet 9 inches, C. T. Parks was the only one who could clear it.

A very interesting exhibition was the Roberts dumb bell drill, in which 25 members took part, and it was well done. The various movements were creditably executed. In that drill all who took part swung the clubs in the same manner at same time as the leader.

For the Indian club race there were three contestants. Levern finished first, Leavitt second and Cavanagh third.

The pole vault created much excitement. Messrs. Smith, Richardson, Collins and Maiden entered. The victor was Smith, with Richardson close to him. The highest jump was 7 feet 8 inches.

The elephant race was a laughable one, and was won by Oulette and Bookman. The other contestants were Levern and Deadman, Collins and Secrist, Alpena and Cavanagh.

Very interesting specialty work on the horizontal bars was done by Messrs. Alpena, Oulette and Jones, and Messrs. Smith, Oulette and Alpena did some good tumbling.

The pyramids were interesting and creditable. The last created much amusement. The first one was made by three members standing on the floor, three more got on the shoulders of the first three, and another member then got on the top of the second tier.

We congratulate the members of the Y. M. C. A., on the very successful and pleasing manner they carried out the program. It was interesting and furnished a pleasant and agreeable evening's amusement to the citizens present.
