

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS,

Interesting Field Day Exercises by the Boys of the West Side.

The weather yesterday afternoon was just right for the field day sports of the West Side High School Athletic Club, at the fair ground. The attendance was not large, but the sports were warmly contested and were interesting throughout.

The sports began at 2:30 o'clock, with Charles Bretherton, Charles Porter and W. S. Beck as judges, and Louis Worch as starter. The following were the prize winners:

Throwing hammer—Joseph Needham; score, 64 feet 7 inches.

Putting shot—Joseph Needham and Dudley True tied; score, 27 feet 10 inches; to be settled later.

One hundred yard dash—Chas. Tinker; time, 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ seconds.

Running high jump—Dudley True; clearing the bar at 5 feet 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. This beats the university record by 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Hurdle race—Ralph Gaines; time, 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds.

Running broad jump—Dudley True; covering 16 feet 1 inch.

Standing high jump—Dwight Oliver; clearing 4 feet.

Three jumps—Chas. Tinker; score 27 feet 5 inches.

Two hundred and twenty yard dash—Ralph Gaines; time 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds.

Throwing ball—Dudley True; distance 285 feet 7 inches.

Mile run—Percy Wright won; Hawkins second; time, 5:52 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Pole vault—Frank Waldo; score 8 feet 4 inches.

Half mile bicycle race—Chas. Tinker won; time, 1:44.

Running hop, step and jump—Dudley True and Chas. Tinker, tied; score, 35 feet 8 inches. To be settled later.

Standing broad jump—Dwight Oliver; score, 9 feet.

Standing hop, step and jump—Dwight Oliver; score, 25 feet 6 inches.

Four hundred and forty yard dash—Dwight Oliver; time, 1:19.

The tug of war between the seniors and juniors was won by the former, who pulled the latter 72 feet over the line.

The medals are awarded as follows: 100 yard dash, Chas. Tinker; running broad jump, Dudley True; hop, step and jump, Dwight Oliver; half mile bicycle race, Chas. Tinker; pole vault, Frank Waldo; hurdle race, Ralph Gaines; mile run, Percy Wright. The medal for putting the shot will fall to Dudley True or Joseph Needham, as the tie is settled.
