The Freshmen Won the Day.

Ann Arbor, May 20.—(Special).—The spring field-day contests of the athletic association were held to-day and proved very successful. The day was perfect and about 700 attended, a quarter of them being co-ed. The contests were fair, the 100 and 200-yard dashes being close and exciting. The leaders were not over a foot apart as they crossed the line. The bicycle races were interesting, and the favorite, Farnabee, was easily beaten in the two-mile race by Helden, who also captured the mile race with ease. The contests excited unusual interest for two reasons: The winners and seconds are to represent the university at the intercollegiate contests at Chicago, and the student's lecture association had put up a fine silver prize cup to be awarded the class capturing the most contests. In this the freshmen were victors, winning five firsts, five seconds and two thirds. The score of the points by classes was: Freshmen 42, sophomores 18, juniors 11, seniors 13, junior class 20, senior class 5, class 7, medical 5. The contests were won as follows:

400-yard dash, won by Ashby, 85 seconds; Sanderson second.

Mile bicycle race, won by Helden, 2:52; Scully second.

High kick, won by Trus, 8 feet 8 inches; Geary second.

Half-mile run, won by Gross, 2:10 1-5; Holt second.

Standing broad jump, won by Geary, 9 feet 7 inches; Coffin second.

Field Day at Ypsilanti.

Ypsilanti, May 20.—(Special).—Normal field day exercises were held this afternoon under favorable auspices with Prof. Barbour, Scherzer and McFarlan, judges. The events moved off nicely, resulting as follows: 100-yard dash, Morse first, Jennings second, time, :10 4-5; 440 yards run, Churchill first, Adams second, time, 65 seconds; the hurdle race did not fill; quarter-mile bicycle, Stoffer first, McChesney second, time, :10 3-5; mile bicycle, Stoffer first, Constock second, time, 5:50; 880-yard run, Churchill first, Adams second, time, 2:55; 100-yard slow bicycle, Stoffer won; one-mile run declared off; standing jump, Bradley 10-2, Harris 9-8; running jump, Barker 10 feet, Harris 19-1; running hop, step and jump, Armstrong 41-3, Harris second; high jump, Armstrong 5-3, Morse 3 feet, putting shot, Paton 22-9, Bradley 32-1; throwing sixteen-pound hammer, Paton 75-0, Geary 85-0. The exercises closed with a poor exhibition of ball playing between the Normals and Junior Levee. Both teams seemed to consider it a practice game and every lining saw men in changed positions. At the close the score was 24 to 13, with the levee ahead.

Albion is Ready for Them.
