

**Field Day at Kalamazoo.**

Kalamazoo, Mich., May 25.—(Special.)—Splendid weather and an unprecedented crowd of spectators made the opening of the Kalamazoo College annual field day on the college campus this morning a success. A holiday was granted by the faculty in order that all students might attend. Training had been thorough and the men were in excellent shape. Following were the events of the morning with winners and their time:

Half-mile run—H. S. Bullock, 2:25 4-5. Throwing 16-pound hammer—Wheeler, 64 feet 5 inches. Standing broad jump—Lineau, 9 feet 2 3-4 inches. 100-yard dash—Miller, :12. Running broad jump—Hayne, 17 feet 7 inches. Quarter-mile dash—H. S. Bullock, 1:04 1-5. Putting shot—Wheeler, 35 feet. Three-legged race—Gilbert and Bullock. Mile relay race—Juniors vs. fourth year's preparatory, won by latter, 4:14. Standing high jump—Hayne, 3 feet 11 inches. Running hop-step-and-jump—Hayne, 40 feet 11 1-2 inches. Obstacle race—Gilbert.

In the afternoon a large and enthusiastic crowd witnessed the tennis tournament. The winners were as follows: Gentlemen's doubles—Magill and Axtell; ladies' doubles—Misses Taylor and Hart; gentlemen's singles—Axtell; ladies' singles—Miss Bennett. The remaining events of the afternoon resulted as follows:

Standing high kick—Wheeler, 12 inches above head. Running high jump—Hayne, 5 feet 3 inches. Running high kick—Hayne, 8 feet. Tug of war—College vs. preparatory department, won by former. Tub race on Mirror lake—Westledge.

The features of the day were the splendid work of Coe Hayne, the youngest of the contestants. Attractive prizes for all contests were given by local merchants. The judges were Dr. Gregg, of Kalamazoo Y. M. C. A., and F. P. Clark. Many visitors were here from out of town and to-day's contests were successful in every way. The principal event to-morrow will be the ball game between Kalamazoo College and Albion.
