

State High School Boys Meet May 29 and 30.

Lansing, Mich., March 7.—(Special.)—The Michigan High School Athletic Association held the last session of its annual meeting here to-night. The board decided on May 29 and 30 as the dates for the athletic days. The indoor events and championship basebail gaine will be held on the 29th, the field events on the 30th. There will be nineteen gold medals and four silver ones, two special all-around medals and a trophy for the school making the highest number of points.

Allan P. Cox and H. Coy Glidden, of the Detroit high school, were here investigating the association and, although there was opposition to it, when they became convinced of its desirability, they succeeded in getting their club into the association. Detroit has the name for being very fast in athietics, but the two boys out-talked their opponents. The association is in very fine condition in developing school athietics and its rules in regard to contestants will settle the difficulties the D. H. S. A. C. has been having in respect to men taking part who were deficient in studies. Each participant must have a standing of "good" and take ten hours a week work. Certificates to this effect must be had from the principal. Detroit will probably send about twenty-five men to the meet. They are matched against Ann Arbor, their old rivals, in the preliminary ball games, and Detroit has the choice of places for the game. The D. H. S. A. C. men are very well pleased with the result of their work.
