The Inter-Association Field Day Was a Success.

Winners of the Various Events

What One Voter Has to Say Regarding the Political Situation—Interesting Metropolitan Notes.

The most interesting field day in the history of Upper Peninsula amateur athletics was held at the Calumet Athletic park yesterday and the attendance was the largest that has ever been to any similar event in the county. 2,000 people crowding the bleachers and grand stand, and taking the liveliest kind of interest in every event.

The day's events were all run off in good shape, there being hardly any kicking, and every body, including the contestants, praising Referee F. N. Hanson for his fair and impartial decisions all the way through.

In the bicycle races Chegwidden, a comparatively new rider, carried off all the honors and Harris did not share the glory as well as his friends expected, not taking any of the leads and losing the five-mile race to Leary in perhaps the finest race of the day. The bicycle riders did good work in every instance, although Leary played it hard luck, but redeemed himself in the five-mile race. The crowd went wild when Leary won this event and he was carried around the field on the shoulders of enthusiastic friends.

The Lake Linden boys put up excellent work in the jumping and pole vaulting contests, and there was a large attendance of rooters from that city. Hancock people did not show up to any extent whatever.
