

**OSHKOSH BOYS DO WELL.**

**COMSTOCK AND WARD WIN HONORS AT MADISON.**

Twenty-Six Schools and Over 500 Contestants in the High School Inter-Scholastic Field Day Events—Ward Suffers a Bad Fall.

Oshkosh with only four men entered in the high school inter-scholastic field day events at Madison Saturday pointed out first in two of the fifteen events, a record for the number of men entered, equalled by none of the other schools. In number of points won, Oshkosh naturally was unable to score as many as the schools that were each represented by ten, twelve and fifteen athletes. Of the twenty-six schools competing, however, Oshkosh is tied with Madison and Madison for eighth position, each securing nine points. Comstock of Oshkosh won the mile bicycle race in 2:39.5, breaking the previous high school state record. Ward of this city in the pole vault was tied with Boyle of Milwaukee, each having gone over the cross bar at 19 feet 2 inches, and were trying for a higher mark when Ward had the misfortune to break his pole in vaulting when some ten feet in the air, and he fell to the ground, striking on his shoulder. It was feared at first that his back was broken, but he soon revived, but was unable to continue in the contest and the event was declared a draw, the points for first honors being evenly divided between the Milwaukee man and the Oshkosh man. Following are the points scored by the schools: Ishpeming 29, W. S. Milwaukee 29, Segonsme 11, S. S. Milwaukee 11, Manitowish 11, Port du Lac 11, Evansville 10, Madison 9, Oshkosh 9, Manson 9, Fox Lake 5, E. S. Milwaukee 5, Dodgeville 5, Manitowish 11, Green Bay 1. Other schools competing were Columbus, Carroll, Colby, Delavan, Prairie du Sac, Whitewater, Lake Mills, Racine, Elkhorn, Holmen, Ft. Atkinson and Janesville.

Running broad jump—H. Johnson, Ishpeming, first; Schroeder, Madison, second; F. Johnson, Ishpeming, third. Distance, 29 feet 8 inches.

Flank in 100 yard hurdles—Anderson, Manitowish, first; C. Barab, Segonsme, second; Grinnell, Madison, third. Time 28.5 seconds.

The 200 yard run—Hammer, Fox Lake, first; Edward John, Delavan, second; C. Kimball, Green Bay, third. Time 2:14.5; record 2:11.5.

Hammer three (twenty pound)—Dunham, Ishpeming, first; Patterson, Evansville, second; Schilling, Ishpeming, third. Distance 113 feet 2 inches; previous record, 102 feet 11 inches.

Half mile walk—Won by Hartman, South Side Milwaukee, second; Bertho, South Side Milwaukee, third; Young, Evansville, time 1:48. This established a record.

The 220 yard run—Won by Jones, Manitowish, Cole, West Side Milwaukee, second; Hughes, Fox Lake, third. Time 25 seconds.

The 300 yard run—Manitowish, first; West Side Milwaukee, second; West Side Milwaukee, third. Time 3:25.5 seconds; previous inter-scholastic record, 3:15.5.

The 400 yard run—Ishpeming, first; Neauame, second; Marinette, third. Time 5:4.5; record, 5:23.5.

Mile run—Oshonson, first; East Side Milwaukee, second; Madison, third. Time 5:01.5; record 4:55.

The 120 yard hurdle—Evansville, first; West Side Milwaukee, second; Madison, third. Time 3:15; record 3:2.5.

Mile bicycle race—Won by Comstock of Oshkosh; Gwynn, South Side Milwaukee, second; Treloven, Fox Lake, third. Time 2:39.5. This established a record in this event.

Pole vault—Tied in a tie between Boyle of West Side Milwaukee and Ward of Oshkosh; Schupp, West Side Milwaukee, third. Height 19 feet, breaking the previous record of 18 feet 5 inch.

Relay race—Won by Ishpeming; Port du Lac, second; and Madison, third.

Half mile walk—South Side Milwaukee, first and second; Evansville, third. Time 1:48, establishing a record.

Running high jump—West Side High, Milwaukee, first; Fox Lake, second; Manitowish, third. Height, 5 feet, 4 1/2 inches; previous record 5 feet 4 1/2 inches.

Twenty pound shot—Segonsme, first; Ishpeming, second; Evansville, third. Distance, 40 feet, 8 inches; record 32 feet 1/2 inches.

**FEELING OF EACH OTHER.**

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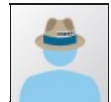
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
