HIGH SCHOOL GAMES AT THE D. A. C. WERE INTERESTING.

WIDMAN RAN REMARKABLY FAST IN THE QUARTER MILE.

The Ball Team Was Beaten by a Delta Picked Nine—The Summaries.

Some very creditable events were brought off yesterday afternoon at the D. A. C. grounds, where the High School Athletics Association held its annual field day. There were not many present, but the winners were enthusiastically cheered by their fellow students and the co-eds who attended. Walker's work in the 100 yards and 200 yards dashes was noticeably good. Avery outdid himself, winning first in the shot put, the hammer throw and the running broad jump, and breaking the school record for the shot put. Dodds, in the two-mile and Stagg, in the one-fourth mile bicycle events, came in easy winners. Snow cleared a good distance in the high jump. Whether the timers in the 400 yards dash were exact or not cannot be positively stated, but they caught Widman at the tape in 51 2-3 seconds, remarkable time if true.

100 yards dash—First, Walker (2 yards); second, Widman (scratch); third, Symington (1 yard); time, 10 1-4 seconds. Killeman, McArthur, Kirby, Avery and Nichols also ran.

200 yards dash—First, Walker (5 yards); second, Widman (scratch); third, Killeman (scratch); time, 21 seconds.

400 yards dash—First, Widman (scratch); second, McArthur (6 yards); time, 51 2-3 seconds.

800 yards run—First, Mera (scratch); second, Waterman (scratch); time, 2 minutes 15 1-2 seconds.

200 yards hurdles—First, Symington (scratch); second, Waterman (scratch); time, 29 4-5 seconds.

Quarter mile bicycle—First, Stagg; second, Mann; third, Dodds; time 28 4-5 seconds.

Half mile bicycle—First, Phelps; second, Dodds; third, Stagg; all scratch; time, 1:18.

Two mile bicycle race—First, Dodds (scratch); second, Phelps (20 yards); time, 6:36 3-4.

Half mile walk—First, Standish (scratch); second, Whitney (15 yards); time, 1:25.

Pole vault—First, Waterman; second, McArthur, both scratch; height, 9 ft. 2 in.

Shot put—First, Avery (scratch); second, Snow (15 ft.); third, Symington (16 ft.); distance, 32 ft. 5 in.

Hammer throw—First, Avery (scratch); second, Ribbing (6 ft.); distance, 11 ft.

Running broad jump—First, Avery (scratch); second, Snow (scratch); distance, 15 ft. 5 in.

Running high jump—First, Snow (scratch); second, Waterman (3 in.); third, Avery (4 in.); height, 5 ft. 7 in.
