

ON THE D. A. C. TRACK

YESTERDAY'S FIELD DAY BEGAN A REVIVAL OF INTEREST.

WIDMAN WON THE 100 YARDS IN 10 3-5 SECONDS.

Events Were Well Contested—Attendance 500.

After a long and quiet interval spiked shoes again sped over the cinders at the D. A. C. track yesterday afternoon and hammer and shot again struck the sod with dull and deadened thud. Thirteen events, more or less interesting, were brought off. Although at times the meeting dragged between events, during the dashes, especially, considerable enthusiasm was aroused. Widman won the 100 yards handily from scratch and was looked on to take the 220, but fell. Hatch's performances in the 440 and the half mile were especially good, the time being 23:55 from five yards and 2:11 from scratch, respectively. Will Dodds easily took both bicycle events; E. L. Warner the pole vault; Nell Snow the hammer throw and the running high jump; C. D. Waterman the 220 yards hurdle. There was an attendance of 500. Many of them were old enthusiasts in the line of track athletics. While there was nothing startling in any of yesterday's performances, the ball is started rolling and the old-time athletic enthusiasm for which the D. A. C. was noted bids fair to be revived.
