

### THE ANNUAL FIELD DAY

**HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES GOT THEIR FIRST TRYING OUT.**

**THE NEXT WILL BE AT ANN ARBOR ON SATURDAY.**

Detroit High School Nine Defeated the Orchard Lake Nine.

Very creditable games were held yesterday by the members of the Detroit Central High School Athletic Association, and the attendance was larger than at most of the annual field days heretofore. The local team won an interesting game of baseball from Orchard Lake, 11 to 3. Although the time in some of the events was not record-breaking, all the numbers on the program were interesting to the spectators, and the events were brought with a snap and vigor which reflects credit on the directors of the association and the officers of the day.

Among the winners, D. Downing carried off the bicycle race with apparent ease, rolling steadily in each until the proper time for him to sprint. In the half-mile he collided at the start and was thrown off his wheel so that he was unable to catch the other riders. W. Roberts, in the half-mile run, surpassed his competitor and made a pretty run in 1 minute 21 seconds. H. Hill won the quarter-mile hand race, in 15 3/4 seconds. The summary follows:

**1/2-mile run**—W. Roberts won; H. Hill, second; J. Walker, third, time 4 1/4 minutes.

**1-mile run**—W. Reibling won; W. Bland, second; H. Moore, third, distance, 32 ft. 6 in.

**400-yard run**—W. Avery won 53 ft. 6 in.; W. Reibling, second, 77 ft. 4 in.

**Four hundred and forty yard run**—R. Hill won; W. Reibling, second, time 2 1/2 minutes.

**Two-mile bicycle race**—D. Downing won; H. Towser, second; H. Ford, third, time, 5 1/4 in.
