

## Start of the Big Meet at Ann Arbor.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 27 .- (Special.)-The first interscholastic meet ever held under the auspices of the university athletic association opened auspiciously to-night with an indoor meet in the Waterman gymnasium. Visitors from the various high schools in the state have been arriving all day, and it is estimated that some 200 are already here. Detroit, Lausing, Bay City, Pontiac, Jackson, Adrian, Mt. Clemens and Ionia are represent-The events contested this ed by delegations. evening do not count in determining the number of points which go to the credit of each school, but the championship will be settled entirely on the basis of points won to-morrow in the bicycle, track and field events. Silver and bronze medals were given to the first and second men in the 40-yard dash and 40-yard hurdle races, while the winners of the wreating bouts received gold championship medals.

The Ann Arbor and Lansing high schools divided up the honors to-night, and the former's athletes came out a little chead. In the 40-yard dash Jordan surprised everyone by winning from Christopher, Lansing's crack. The wrestling events were the best high school contests of the kind ever seen in the gyranasium.
