

**THE SPORTS AT HARTFORD.**

COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL FIELD DAY A SUCCESS—SOUTH HAVEN LED ALL COMPETITORS.

Field day at Hartford last Saturday was a success, but owing to the weather a few of the sports could not be carried out. South Haven secured 7 first, 2 second and 6 third prizes, 116 points; Bangor 1 first, 3 seconds and 2 thirds, 49 points; Lawrence 1 second and 3 thirds, 23 points; Lawton 3 first and 1 second, 38 points; Paw Paw 4 seconds, 32 points; Decatur 1 first, 1 second and 1 third, 23 points. Following are the events and results:

100 yard running race, H. Mitchell of South Haven first, W. J. Warner of Paw Paw second, C. Parks of Lawrence third; time 11 seconds.

Half mile bicycle race, A. More of South Haven first, C. DeHaven of Bangor second, H. Mitchell of South Haven third; time 1:17.

Running broad jump, B. Tillou of Lawton first, 19.2 feet; C. Cumings of Paw Paw second, 17.8 feet; C. Parks of Lawrence third, 17.3 feet.

220 yard run, C. Ross of South Haven first, W. J. Warner of Paw Paw second, W. Hamilton of Bangor third; time 26 seconds.

Running high kick, E. Ross of Bangor first, B. Grimes of Bangor second and L. Clement of South Haven third. The highest kick was 7 feet 3½ inches.

One mile bicycle race, F. Jewett of Decatur first, A. More of South Haven second, H. Mitchell of South Haven third; time 2:57.

120 yard hurdle race, C. Ross of South Haven first, W. Hamilton of Bangor second and W. Webster of South Haven third; time 20 1-5 seconds.

After the hurdle race the crowds adjourned to dinner, which was hard to find.

In the afternoon, the sports were continued on the base ball grounds. The first was the hammer throwing, which was considered by some of the schools unfair, as the hammer was nothing more nor less than an 16 pound ball and chain with a handle on the end. The contest resulted as follows: H. Barner of South Haven first, 70.4 feet; L. Wheeler of South Haven second, 68 feet; C. Parks of Lawrence third, 67 feet.
