

D. H. S. WON THE MEET

ANN ARBOR RAN A CLOSE SECOND TO DETROIT.

ELLIS IS THE BOY TO WHOM ALL CREDIT IS DUE.

FAST TIME MADE ON A WATER-SOAKED TRACK.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 27.—(Special)—The interscholastic high school meet was won this afternoon by the sturdy young athletes of the Detroit high school by a margin of seven points over Ann Arbor, their nearest competitor. Despite the fact that the events were run off in a water soaked field and track, the records made were very creditable and ahead of the standard set last year. A steady down-pour of rain made it impossible to pull the event off in the morning, for the sky cleared about 2 o'clock and it was decided to carry out the programme.

The Detroit team won by doing the best all round work, and Ells, one of the winners of the 100 and 200 yard dashes, was the performer of the meet as well as the chief point winner on this score. He won the first in the 100 and 200 yard dashes, doing the latter race in the good time of 21 seconds flat, and first place in both broad and high jumps. His broad jump of 39 feet 3 inches is a performance worthy of a college athlete. Shannon and James, both of Detroit, in clever style, and Hanning carried off first place in the hammer throw. Thompson of Pontiac, Barlow of Greenville and Quaker of Ann Arbor were the other chief point winners. Barlow, who was a good third in one event at the meet last year and the sole representative from Greenville, surprised everyone by winning the mile run handsily and fast securing second place in both the half mile run and mile jump landing, which was the best last year, secured but three points, owing to the loss of her cross sashes, Christopher and Tompkins, who swept everything but that.

The order in which the different schools finished together with the number of points won is as follows: Detroit, 40; Ann Arbor, 33; Pontiac, 25; Adrian, 21; Clemens, 17; Greenville, 11; Saginaw, 7; Mt. Clemens, 5; Ludington, 4; Grand Rapids, 1; Howell, 1. This is opposite to the inverse order which were run off yesterday, in which all Clemens scored 15; Saginaw, 7; Adrian, 5; and Detroit, 4 points. The handsome medals were distributed at the close of the meet. When the last event had been run off, the Detroit delegation escorted their favorites up from the field to the accompaniment of the well known high school yell. Detroit sent out a large representation including an enthusiastic band of a dozen members under the direction of Messrs. Taylor and the center of attraction at the field this afternoon. Most of the visitors have been entertained at the fraternity and society houses, where despite the bad weather they have been given the best kind of a time.
