

ATHLETICS.

Central High School and D. U. S. Have a Chance to Win.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 25.--(Special Telegram.)

—The third inter-scholastic meet opened this afternoon with almost twice as many contestants as have attended previous meets. A swarm of young athletes struck town to-day and fairly swamped the management so far as providing immediate accommodations for the visitors was concerned. The fraternity houses were thrown open and each is entertaining from a dozen to twenty-five high school men. Some idea of the number of contestants can be gained from the fact that there were seven heats in the 100 yard dash, six in the hurdles, and two in the half mile run with a field of eight men in each. Only the preliminaries were run off to-day and darkness had settled before it had been decided who will compete to-morrow in the long list of events. Nearly 300 athletes are entered in the events of the two days. Although the bicycle races and football punting and kicking contests to-morrow may change the results it looks as though the fight for first place would lie between Pontiac, Orchard Lake, Grand Rapids, Detroit Central high school and Detroit University school, with Ann Arbor a possible claimant for first honors.
