

**COUNTY FIELD DAY.**  
**GREAT SUCCESS IN PAW PAW LAST SATURDAY.**

PAW PAW WINS FIRST HONORS, OF COURSE—SEVENTH GRADE FORGED TO BE COUNTRY WITH SECOND PLACE—RESULT OF THE SCHOOL SPORTS IN DETAIL.

The field day of the Van Buren county high schools was held in this village on Saturday last and was a success in every particular. All the events on the official program, except three, were completed, and the sports, enlivened by music from the Paw Paw band, made it a day of pleasure.

The special train, which arrived here at nine o'clock from South Haven, was packed to its fullest capacity with people from all along the line of the S. L. & E. and the P. M. from Grand Junction. The regular train at 10:28 a. m. also brought many lovers of sports from the western part of the county. There were also some present from Leoson, Decatur and the south part of the county. Those from the north part of the county came in by the wagon, load and a wheel. Probably never before were so many boys and girls and young people assembled in the county, and they, with a liberal sprinkling of older heads, made up a big crowd.

Four high schools of the county took part in the program: South Haven, Gobbleville, Keeler and Paw Paw. Paw carried away the first honors, South Haven, second Gobbleville third.

The program opened shortly after 10 o'clock with the 100 yard dash, which was won by Guy Warner of Paw Paw; Ross Broughton of Paw Paw second; time 11 seconds.

The one-mile bicycle race was won by Will Allen of Paw Paw, which was a very close race, Allen winning by only a few inches. R. Barcal of South Haven winning second.

The running broad jump was won by Ed Davis and second by Wade Kilbier, both of Paw Paw; distance 18 feet 6 inches. South Haven had two contestants.

The one-half mile run was won by B. Donahue of South Haven, but it is claimed he tripped Glenn Warner of Paw Paw as the latter was about to pass him. This race was protested, but was given Donahue, Fred Mason of Paw Paw winning second.

The standing hop, step and jump was won by Roy Cleveland of Paw Paw, R. McCrimmon of South Haven second; distance 28 feet 2 inches.

The 12 pound hammer throw was won by A. Chasleau of South Haven, second by A. Hymanes of Gobbleville; distance 85 feet.

The running high jump was won by R. McCrimmon of South Haven, second by L. Douglas of Paw Paw; height 4 feet 9 inches.

The 1/4 mile bicycle race was won by Harry Folsom, second by A. Dunnington, both of Paw Paw.

The 220 yard dash was won by Guy Warner of Paw Paw, second by Fred Mason of Paw Paw.

Throwing base ball was won by Frank Stanger, second by Harry Folsom, both of Paw Paw; distance 325 feet.

Pole vaulting was won by B. Donahue of South Haven, N. Moore of the same place second; height 7 feet 10 inches.

Running hop, step and jump was won by Wade Kilbier of Paw Paw, R. Barcal of South Haven second; distance 38 feet 11 inches.

440 yard run was won by B. Donahue of South Haven, Fred Mason of Paw Paw winning second.

The half mile bicycle race was won by Will Allen, second by Harry Folsom, both of Paw Paw.

Running high kick was won by L. Sage of Gobbleville, second by R. McCrimmon of South Haven; height 8 feet 1 inch.

Standing broad jump was won by Roy Cleveland of Paw Paw, R. McCrimmon of South Haven second; distance 9 feet 5 inches.

The 220 yard hurdle race, 12 pound shot put and one mile relay race did not take place.

The ball game between Paw Paw and Gobbleville was not finished. Three innings were played. The score at the end of the second inning stood two nothing in Paw Paw's favor. In the third inning, E. Davis, Paw Paw's catcher, was hit on the nose by a foul ball and quite severely cut. The game between the two clubs will be played at Gobbleville next Saturday.
