

UNIVERSITY GETS FOURTH PLACE.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 25.—(Special.)—The Detroit Central High School won the interscholastic meet, held here this afternoon, in a blaze of glory by winning a strong second in the relay race. The relay was the last event on the programme, and the result of the meet was in doubt until the finish. The final scores stood:

D. C. H. S., 34; Ann Arbor, 33; Detroit University School, 19; Cleveland University School, 17. Detroit and Grand Rapids were tied for fifth place with a score of 16.

A heavy cold rain started in just after the events were started, and consequently prevented much injury to records. Early in the afternoon the Ann Arbor High School looked like a sure winner, but the work of Speik, of Chicago, in the field events and Keeler, Hayes, and Osborn for the D. C. H. S., showed that the affair was to be closely contested. Had the day been better there is no doubt but that more records would have suffered.

All the contestants with the exception of the Michigan Military Academy, are well satisfied with the result, and the work of the officials. Orchard Lake has a reputation for "knocking," and did not fail to preserve the reputation during the meet. The following will show how it happened:
