D. U. S. BEST ATHLETE.

ALL-AROUND COLBURN WON CHAMPIONSHIP YESTERDAY.

The all-round athletic meet for the championship of the D. U. S. was run off yesterday afternoon on the school field and terday afternoon on the school field and proved to be a most interesting contest. The competition was close and the result was in doubt until the last event was run. This is the first time such an event has been contested in interscholastic circles in Detroit, and the winner, W. B. Colburn, '03, is to be congratulated on his good work in every event. The most remarkable feature of the meet was the broad jumping of Woodward, '02, who jumped 20 feet \$12 inches without any previous training, breaking the Michigan interscholastic record, for which he is entitled to wear the record sweater of the D. U. S. Woodward's running in the 440 was very fast, as was Davidson's 100 yards. The latter also did some fine work in the shot put. Colburn's consistent showing in every one of the track events was what won him the award of the beatiful Trinity cup, upon which will be engraved fine winner's name. The best records in each event were as follows:

100-yard dash: Davidson, 10 2-5 seconds, 440 yards; Woodward, 54 2-5 seconds, Mile: Celburn, 5 minutes 31 seconds, 120 yards low hurdles: Patterson and Woodward, 15 1-5 seconds, High jump: Patterson, 5 feet 5 inches, Broad jump: Woodward, 20 feet \$12 inches, 12-pound shot put; Davidson, 10 feet, 7 inches, 12-pound hammer: Colburn, 22 feet 7 inches, Pole vault: Colburn, 6 feet 9 inches.

The events were scored according to the rules of the A. A. U., on the basis of 1,000 points for equaling the world's record, with a proportional less number for each second slower than the record. The score of points was as follows: proved to be a most interesting contest.
