Duffy Failed of Records.

New York, June 7.—At the New York Athletic Club meeting to-day Arthur F. Duffy, of Georgetown university, the fastest amateur sprinter in the world, essayed to break the records for 60 and 50 yards, established several years ago by the late Lon Myers. In the 60 yards dash he broke the time 6:25 seconds, just equalling the world's record. After he had rested, Duffy tried for the 50 yards record, which is 5:12 seconds, but only succeeded in running the distance in 5:25 seconds, one-eighth of a second behind the record.

Purdue Won From Notre Dame.

Terre Haute, Ind., June 7.—Purdue's victory at the Indiana state field and track meet was a surprise, as it was generally believed Notre Dame's strong team would outclass those from the other colleges. Six of the Notre Dame men, however, were prevented from coming by the action of the faculty. The state record for 225 yard dash was lowered one-fifth of a second, while the record for the 200 yard hurdle and the 100 yard dash were equalled.
