

WALKAWAY FOR D. U. S.

SCORED MORE POINTS THAN OTHER
TWO SCHOOLS COMBINED.

ANN ARBOR WAS SECOND, AND DETROIT
CENTRAL HIGH TRAILED.

D. U. S. WAS FIRST IN EIGHT OF THE
TEN EVENTS.

Ann Arbor, March 21.—(Special.) The indoor meet, in which Detroit University school, Detroit Central high and Ann Arbor high competed to-night, resulted in a walkaway by the university school boys, who scored 48 points, more than the other two teams combined. The table of points won is as follows:

Detroit University school team took place in every event except the high jump and shot put, and in the struggle to get the tie for second place in the jump, P. of the D. U. S. tied Lester's best, while the Detroit schools ran a dead heat race the night, Ann Arbor being disqualified for touching team mate, E. Keeler in the dash, F. Keeler in the middle distance, Colburn in the long run and Nicol in hurdles and shotput, make a strong case for D. U. S., and around them is built a great bunch of helpers.

It looks positively certain that the University school will win the state interscholastic championship this year. Ann Arbor is a well-balanced team, but not strong enough for the present. Keeler had easy in the dash, and Nicol won the mile almost in barely form. He suffered from the loss of a piecemaker in the mile against Colburn, but it is doubtful if he could win against the Detroit runner under other conditions. Kaywood had lead on Vall for second place in the quarter mile, but faltered at the end and treated the string together. Rosenberg of Ann Arbor, was beaten by Wendell, Detroit, but a half inch in the shot-put.

1 mile run—Colburn (D. U. S.), won; Nantz (A. A.), second; Alton (A. A.), third. Time, 4:37 1/2.

High Jump—Lester (D. C. H.), won a net 1 inch; Ford (D. U. S.) and How (A. A.) tied for second.

Shotput—Wendell (D. U. S.), won; Rosenberg (A. A.), second; Nicol (D. U. S.) third. Distance, 38 feet 10 1/2 inches.

Relay—D. U. S. and D. C. H. S. tied first place. Ann Arbor disqualified.
