ATHLETIC EVENT OF CO-EDS

Comes Off at Michigan University—Miss Stark Is the Feature Both as to Feats and Modesty.

Ann Arbor, Mich., March 30. — The first co-ed athletic event ever held at the University of Michigan was won Saturday by the sophomore girls with 37 points, freshwomen second, with 36 points. The star of the meet was Miss Emily Stark, a freshwoman of Ann Arbor, who won four firsts, counting twenty points. She won the high jump, and the broad jump at 13 feet 11 inches; springboard jump at 5 feet 6 inches, and high jump from the flying rings at 5 feet 8 inches.

The feature of the meet was Miss

Stark's modesty in refusing to go after the women's world high jump record of 4 feet 4 inches. She did 4 feet, clearing the bar by six inches, but refused to risk the fame attendant on becoming a world's champion, so would not try with the bar above four feet. The hopping race was won by Miss

Hayes, sophomore, of Ann Arbor, in six seconds. Instead of putting the shot, the girls threw the inflated ball. Miss McNeirney, senior, Port Huron, Mich., won at distance throwing; Miss Thompson, senior, of Marine City, Mich., at high throwing, and Miss Stratton, junior, of Ann Arbor, at accuracy throwing.
