

FIELD DAY AT HOWELL.

**LOCALS MADE CLEAN SWEEP IN
NEARLY ALL EVENTS.**

Howell, Mich., May 15.—(Special.)—The annual field day of the Howell High school took place here to-day with Williamston High school competing. Howell won first place in all the events with the exception of the pole vault, which was won by Higbee, 8 feet 8 inches. The chances of record breaking were very poor, owing to the condition of the grounds.

The events were pulled off as follows: 120 yard hurdle—Barnes, first; Maher, second. Shot put—Barnes, first; Harris, second. 33ft. 9 in. Hammer throw—Cavell, first, 106 feet 3 inches. Standing high jump—Tooley, first, 4 feet 5 in. Mile foot race—Beckwith, first; Rix, second. Half mile run—H. Beckwith, first; J. Beckwith, second; time, 2:26. 220 yard run—Barnes, first; Beckwith, second; time, 27 seconds. 100 yard dash—Tooley, first; Barnes, second; time, 10 3-5 sec. 440 yard run—Monroe, first; Rix, second. High jump—Tooley, first; Beckwith, second; height, 4 ft. 8 in.

Points scored were about 85 to 22 in favor of Howell. In the ball game Williamston was shut out by score of 15 to 0. Batteries—Newcomb and Tooley; Harris and Akers. Howell will send about fifteen candidates to compete for honors at the interscholastic field day at Ann Arbor.
