

**GALESBURG FIELD DAY.**

**VICKSBURG SCORED MOST POINTS AND WON TROPHY.**

Galesburg, Mich., May 16.—(Special.) —With a greatly increased attendance in the afternoon, there was a proportionate increase in enthusiasm at the games here. The high kick went to Vicksburg, as Harrington accomplished seven feet eleven and one-half inches; Johnson, of Augusta, second. The results follow: One-fourth mile bicycle race, limited to boys under sixteen—Horsefall, Vicksburg, first; Henson, Richland, second; Buchanan, Augusta, third. Stand and broad jump —Notley, Vicksburg, 8 feet, 8 inches. Pole vault—Bennett, Richland, 6 feet, 10 inches. Hop, step and jump—Mason, of Richland, 34 feet, 9 inches. Mile bicycle race—Strong, Vicksburg. Standing broad jump—Smith, Vicksburg, 8 feet, 2 inches. 220-yard run—Horton, Vicksburg, first; Terry, Schoolcraft, second. Pole vault—Terry, 7 feet, 10 inches; Adams, Richland, second.

Galesburg won the tug-of-war, and the young ladies' basketball trophy went to Vicksburg. The great interest of the occasion centered about the final ball game, in which Vicksburg represented the southern and Galesburg the northern schools of the county. The score was a constant series of ciphers until the fifth inning, when Galesburg took a brace and scored nine, to which two were added later. Vicksburg succeeded in scoring two, thus surrendering the elegant trophy to Galesburg. The latter won through the phenomenal pitching of Payne. The occasion was a complete success from start to finish. Vicksburg takes the athletic trophy for scoring the greatest number of points.
