

D. U. S. SIXTH AT NEW HAVEN

FIVE OF THE MEN ON THE TEAM
WERE POINT WINNERS.

KEELER'S HARD LUCK BEAT TEAM
OUT OF SOME POINTS.

SOME SWELL PERFORMANCES FOR
SCHOOL CONTESTS.

New Haven, Ct., May 16.—(Special.)—The Detroit University school track team is pretty well satisfied by the record made in to-day's interscholastic games, under the auspices of the Yale Athletic association, though convinced that only luck prevented its getting an even better place. The Michigan boys finished sixth, competing with twenty schools, a number of which had not sent full teams, merely picking their supposedly sure point winners. Mercersburg won the meet, the points scored by the first six schools being:

Mercersburg, first, 43 1-2; Williston, second, 23 3-5; Andover, third, 13 1-10; Hotchkiss, fourth, 10; Lawrenceville, fifth, 8; Detroit University school, sixth, 7 2-5.

The greatest disappointment to the Detroit boys was in the 100 yards dash and high hurdles. Keeler slipped on the curb of the track and lost his stride for a moment in the trial heat of the 100 yards and did not get into the final, being beaten less than six inches for second place. Time of trial, 10 2-5 seconds. The final of the 100 yards was run in 10 3-6 seconds and should have been easy for Keeler. Keeler won his heat in the 220 dash in 33 seconds, but was pocketed in the final, and only got fourth place. Time, 23 seconds.

Nicol was easily second in 120 hurdles trial heat; time, 18 1-5 seconds. In the final heat he fell over the fourth hurdle and only got fourth place. This was done in record time, 18 seconds. Last year's record was 17 1-5 seconds. Nicol ran well in the trial heat of the 220 hurdles, but was unable to do better than third in the final, as he strained a muscle in the high hurdle final.

Colburn ran a fast mile, getting fourth place. Winner's time, 4:14 4-5; Colburn's time, 4:58 1-5.

In the two-mile run Carhartt, though weak from recent illness, stuck to it gamely and was an easy third, adding two points to the D. U. S. score; time of race, 10 minutes 40 1-5 seconds.

In the high jump, Keena jumper 5 feet 6 1-2 inches, tying with four others for third place. The points were divided, each getting 3-5. For failed at 5 feet 8 1-2 inches. The winner cleared 5 feet 8 1-2 inches.

Five of the six men on the Detroit team scored points.
