ARTHUR MADE NEW D. U. S. SHOT PUT RECORD

Yesterday afternoon at the D.U.S. a track meet was held for the purpose of getting a line on material for next year's athletes, the school purposing to pay even more attention than ever to this branch of training the coming season.

While regular training has not been kept up since school reopened still the boys for the most part are in fair training, as cross-country runs are much in vogue at the school and most of the athletes participate in them. But six events were pulled off yesterday, and as a number of the best athletes are just now more interested in football than in anything else the entry list was not heavy. For the most part there was nothing sensational in the way the contestants performed, except in the weight event. One thing is assured from the result of the shot put, and that is that D.U.S. will have a dangerous man to handle the weights for her next year, in the person of Arthur, a new man, who has just begun to pay attention to putting the shot. Arthur is a strong, sinewy chap, and is getting the knack down fine. His third effort yesterday afternoon lowered both the D.U.S. and D.I.A.L. records, the former of which stood at forty feet, and the latter at 39 feet 3 1-2 inches. Arthur put the 12-pound pellet 41 feet 1 1-2 inches.

The 100 yard dash was one of the best contested events, the contestants finishing in a bunch. Wright had everything his way in the mile run and simply jogged the last lap. Patterson showed well in the high jump and hurdles, both of which events he took without a great deal of effort. Summary:

100 yard dash—Hyde, won; Whelan, second; Penton, third. Time, 10 4-5 seconds. Arthur also competed.

Mile run—Wright, won; Bagley, second. Time, 6:00 1-5.

Half mile run—Penton, won; Whelan, second; Livingstone, third. Time, 2:25 4-5.

High jump—Patterson, won; Gray, second; Reeder, third. Distance, 5 feet 2 inches. Rickel also competed.

100 yards low hurdles—Patterson, won; Gray, second; Schram, third. Time, 13 1-5 seconds.

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
