

DETROIT BOYS DISPLAY FORM

SHOWED UP WELL IN PRELIMINARY
'VARSITY MEET.'

GARRELS CAPTURED SECOND PLACE
IN THE SHOT-PUT.

Ann Arbor, Mich., February 21.—(Special.)—Young Detroit athletes showed up well in the preliminary 'varsity meet' tonight. In the 40-yard dash there were twenty entries, which narrowed down to three in the final, and everybody was on edge of excitement to see if Keeler, of Detroit, could win out over the veterans. However, Archie Hahn remains undefeated, as he beat Keeler by a foot at the tape and Stewart was six inches behind Keeler. Nicol, of Detroit, ran Stewart a close race in the 40-yard hurdles. Hall had the 40-yard easy, as Norcross and Robatock did not start.

Garrels, of Detroit, pushed Bartlett hard for second place. In the shot put Rose, the California boy giant, did not compete, as he has a lame back, but he will be in the freshman meet next Saturday night. Garrels, of Detroit, took second in this event.

Good time was made in the half mile run, considering the early date of training. Keena, of Detroit, showed 'varsity form' in the high jump. The mile run was the best race of the evening. Minor and Daane ran a dead heat. The latter had the inside track on the final sprint and Minor could not circle him. In the relay races Perry, Daane, Coe and Kellogg beat Marphan, Raney, Laub and Hall in 56 seconds, and Norcross, Robatock, Keeler and Stewart won over Hull, Hugg, Reiland and Hahn in 54 2-5 seconds.
