**EASTERN HIGH THE ONLY
SCHOOL NOT TO ENTER.**

**HANDSOME SILVER TROPHY
GOES TO THE WINNER.**

Detroit University school, Central High and Western High have sent in their entries for the school games in connection with the Y. M. C. A. athletic carnival at the Armory on March 3 and each institution has named fourteen men. Eastern High was not heard from, and the chances are that this school will not be represented, the material for a track team not being promising.

Every school has registered more men than can take part, and only those athletes who have shown the best form will represent their schools. From each school three boys may compete in the dash and hurdles, two in the shot put and high jump and four in the relay race. At D. U. S., Malcomson, Corliss, Patterson, Post and Kaywood have shown the best form in practice, the first named two, with Vaughan, being sure to work in the dash for the school. For Central High, Horton will be in the main dependence in the sprint, with Widman and Farnsworth also eligible. Shaw and O'Leary are good hurdlers, while Lawton, Markey and Sloman will compete in the high jump and the weight event. In the dash, Western High will rely on Cull and Atkinson, with Labadie and Sullivan as hard ones to beat in the shot put.

The silver cup offered by the Y. M. C. A. to the winner of the competition between the four schools is a handsome affair, and is now on exhibition in Smith, Sturgeon & Co.'s window.
