

## DUAL MEET ON D. U. S. FIELD

**CLEVELAND UNIVERSITY SCHOOL  
SENDS STRONG TEAM.**

**COMPETITION THIS MORNING ON  
ELMWOOD GROUNDS.**

**FOREST CITY HAS WONDERFUL ATHLETES  
IN COOK.**

Local athletes are centering their attention on the dual track meet this morning on the D. U. S. grounds between Detroit University school and Cleveland University school, the outcome of which will give a good line on the strength of the local 'varsity boys in the D. I. A. L. games, which will be held next Saturday. In meeting the Clevelanders the locals will contest with some of the best 'prep' athletes in the Forest City, and the hopes here are not any too bright. The Detroiters will be somewhat handicapped by the loss of Parsons and Cooley, sprinters, and Mout, jumper, who will be kept out of the competition today because of being behind in their studies. However, as all the other competitors have trained diligently and with much care, surprises may bob up.

On the Cleveland team is one boy who is a host in himself. This wonderful athlete is Cook, who set the Cleveland people talking last Saturday, when he won five events against Western Reserve, scoring firsts in both darts, hammer throw, shot put and discus. He made new school records for the hammer throw and discus and threw the weights all of twenty feet farther than has ever been recorded at the local school. These events are already conceded to him, and his record of 30.10 seconds for the 100 yards should make him a handy winner in that event. D. U. S. is placing all hope in the distance runs, jumps and the pole vault. The games will begin at 2:30 o'clock.
