

## ERNIE VAUGHN IS CHAMPION

FIRST IN ALL-ROUND MEET AT DETROIT U. S.

HAD TO WIN CLOSING EVENT TO  
CINCH TITLE.

STIMSON WAS SECOND, THE ONLY  
CLOSE COMPETITOR.

Ernie Vaughn yesterday won the title of all-around champion of the Detroit University school by taking the annual outdoor meet, which settles the question for the present year and gives the winner the right to have his name inscribed on the Trinity cup.

Though Vaughn won five firsts out of a total of nine events, he never was sure of winning the meet until the finish of the 40-yard run, the final event. Stimson was right at his heels all through the contest, taking three firsts and three seconds in the champion's eyes, besides repeating the trick in the contest for third place.

Patterson, the star high jumper and hurdler of the school, was nearly put out of the running, getting a bad fall in the 120-yard low hurdles, which spoiled his work in the remainder of the event, other wise he would have been a strong contender of the honors.

Post, the baseball man and sprinter, had an off day, the best he could do being two seconds and the same number of thirds; the former being in the 100-yard dash and discus throw; the latter in the hurdles and shot put.

The only real excitement of the day, after Patterson fell, was furnished by the contest between Vaughn and Stimson. When the 40 was called, both were tired from their exertions in the previous eight events and the fraternity ball game, which was played in connection with the meet, but neither thought of withdrawing from the event. When the pistol was fired, Vaughn led his opponent in the scoring by 25 points and needed the race to keep ahead. It was nip and tuck between them all around the track, the former high school man finally crossing the line four seconds ahead of Stimson and getting the meet with a lead of 16 points over his nearest competitor. The summaries:

100-yard dash—Vaughn first, Post second, Stimson third; time, 19 5/8 seconds.

120-yard low hurdles—Vaughn first, Stimson second, Post third; time, 14 seconds.

40-yard run—Vaughn first, Patterson second, Stimson third; time, 32 2/5 seconds.

Hammer throw—Stimson first, 24 feet 3 inches; Patterson second, 32 feet 5 inches; Vaughn third, 72 feet 8 inches.

High jump—Patterson first, 5 feet 4 inches; Stimson and Vaughn tied for second, at 4 feet 8 inches.

Shot-put—Stimson first, 36 feet 2 1/2 inches; Vaughn second, 34 feet 10 inches; Post third, 32 feet 9 inches.

Broad jump—Vaughn first, 18 feet 11 inches; Patterson second, 18 feet 11 1/2 inches; Stimson third, 17 feet 10 1/2 inches.

Pole vault—Vaughn first, 7 feet 9 inches; Stimson second, 7 feet 4 inches; Patterson third, 6 feet 9 inches.

Discus throw—Stimson first, 77 feet 2 inches; Post second, 73 feet 2 inches; Vaughn third, 72 feet 2 inches.

Final scores—Vaughn, 420; Stimson, 414 1/2; Patterson, 392; Post, 242; Bowen, 170.
