Ann Arbor, Mich., May 27.—(Special.)—The big honors of the Michigan interscholastic meet got to the Detroit University School, which took 28 out of 30 points of the meet, and whose athletes broke six of the Michigan interscholastic records. Detroit Central came in second with 14 points, and from the two Detroit schools, central took more than half of the points in the meet. It makes the third time the D. U. S. has carried off the championship in eight years, having previously won the honors in 1894 and 1895.

The meeting opened with a 100-yard race and in the half-mile relay, and the D. U. S. did all the smashing. Patterson set in a new mark of 23.4 seconds in the 100-yard race, and the previous record held by Stewart, who made 22.8 seconds in 1901.

J. Mahon took an awful shock on the night of 23.4 seconds for the 100-yard race, and the D. U. S. slipped a second and two-fifths off their half-mile relay record, made last year, when they were in the lead. The Detroit runners are J. Mahon, Vaughan, Dunsay and Chandler.

The Detroit University school carried over every event, in which it set some new marks. No star was entered from the school in the 200-yard race, but J. Mahon took a well balanced team of four in 57.8 seconds. Second place was taken in the 200 by and 200 yard dash, and third place in the quarter mile, 100 yards and 200 yards. The Detroit team were the winners in every event except the quarter mile, 200 yards and 200 yards. Three points and a half went to the Central team.

In individual work Cook of Chillicothe and Arthur of D. U. S. carried off each scoring 15 points. However, Cook may be said to have the better of it, as he showed three records and a new mark in the 100-yard race. Cook got the gold medal in a jump of 43.5 feet, the high jump for first place and Arthur comes in second in the 100-yard race, who was two gold medals by making first place in both events. Cook comes with a fourth gold medal in the 100-yard race.

In yesterday's sporting there was a notable about nothing to be gained for forty yards in the 100-yard race. The fifty-yard point gate race was the only other event of the meet but together, Mahon, of Cleveland, took a number of points. The two points should have been divided to Arthur Smith of Detroit Central, 14, Lawrence W. Detroit Central, 14, Dudley of Lewis Institute, 14, and Richards of Chillicothe, 14.

There is much talk of a meeting concerning the college destination of the great young athlete, Ed. C. Cook, who has had two offers to go to the University of Michigan and two offers to the University of Wisconsin. Today he expressed himself as desiring to continue in Ann Arbor when he finishes his high school work a year from here.

"Cook is a much better athlete than Ferguson, of Chicago," said Kenne
