Eastern and Western held a dual track meet at Clark park yesterday. Eastern won by a score of 48 to 34. Eastern took six firsts and Western three, the other event resulting in a tie for the honor. Eastern scored all of the points in the 100-yard run and the shotput, and Western did the same in the broad jump. **Summary.**

CENTRAL MAY SEND FOUR TO COMPETE IN STAGG'S MEET AT CHICAGO.

There is a strong probability that Central High school may be represented at Stagg's interscholastic meet at Chicago, June 5, as well as the D. C. S. Should the present plan mature, four "C" men will be sent to the Windy City. They are Captain Widman, Brown, Craig and Harlan. At the Chicago meet but three men are used in the relay race, and Widman, Brown and Craig would make a very strong trio in this event. Widman and Brown would both be used in the 100 and 200 yards dashes, Craig in the high and low hurdle events and Harlan in the mile, which would assure the quartet of some points at least.

Couch Ryan and at least ten of his University school athletes will make the trip, where they hope to down the winner of the M. I. A. L. meet, Lewis Institute. The latter, they figure, will be cut out of second and thirds that set up them at Ann Arbor.

SEVEN FIRSTS TO ONE BOY
McCOMB, OF CASS CITY, STAR OF THUMB GAMES.

Cass City, Mich., June 1.—(Special.)—The annual meeting of the Thumb Athletic association was held here today, and the Cass City schools secured the first place, winning 60 out of the 96 points. Cass won second place with 14 points. Bad Axe third with 16 and Harbor Beach fourth with 16 points.

Frank McComb of Cass City was the star athlete, securing first in all of the seven events in which he was entered, which included 50, 100, 200 and 400-yard runs, high hurdles, standing broad jump and hop, step and jump.
