

# CENTRAL IS WINNER IN BOIS BLANC MEET

## Minus Stars, Local School Beat Out Rivals, Ann Arbor Second, the Fight Being Between These Schools.

Minus several of its brightest stars, Central High school track and field team yesterday sent a delegation of athletes to Bois Blanc park, and in the annual Detroit Athletic club meet, took the second annual field meet from Ann Arbor High school by a narrow margin of 51-2 points. It was a close fight from start to finish, and the leads from the varsity town seem to have a trifle the better of the argument in the early stages of the proceedings.

While the other contestants were not dangerous, some pretty individual work by their performers relieved the monotony of being "also rans." When the smoke had cleared away Central High pointed to 53 points and a goodly number of its medals and banners as the sign of the day's glory. Ann Arbor followed with 53 1/2. The others were: Plymouth High, 15; D. U. S., 12; Detroit college, 10, and Eastern High school, 5.

### Detroit College Star.

In speaking of brilliant performances, the man from the Detroit college, Jimmie McNally, who, by the way, constituted the main squad from that institution, showed remarkable speed in the dashes. His feat of making both the 100 and 200-yard dashes, each garnering 10 points for his school, something to be commented upon. He experienced little difficulty in getting away in both events.

In the weight events, C. Cortrite, a youth with a pair of hefty shoulders, who hails from Plymouth Mich., carried off the honors and incidentally helped himself to such points to go back home with the original record, being rewarded for the feat by a gold medal. Cortrite won first in the discs, and the twelve-pound shot was a close second in the hammer throw.

### Trophies for Central.

Central High adds to its list of trophies the silver cups, one for scoring the greatest number of points and one for winning the honors in the relay race, which was never in doubt from the time C. Cruesee started far ahead of his competitors.

Donald May, from Ann Arbor High, completely outdistanced everybody in the mile and was never in danger. May also ran five in the half-mile. For Eastern, James Suckert appeared to advantage, winning all five points for his school.

In the D. U. S. events, confined to members of the club, Arthur Widman won the 100-yard dash quite handsly, and was easy victor in the 400-yard run. Harold Van Huzan ran first in the 120-yard low hurdles.

The meet was much better handled than that of the track and field meetings about a year ago, everything being run close to the time. This resulted in an early com-

pletion of the program. There was not a hitch at any stage.
