

C. A. A. TEAM EASY WINNER OF THE CENTRAL A. A. U. MEET

Scores 77 Points to University of Chicago's 19— Many Association Records Are Broken— Maroons Take Relay.

The Chicago Athletic association team won the Central A. A. U. track meet at Marshall field yesterday, with 77 points, Mike Butler's men placing in every event. The University of Chicago was second, with 19 points, the Central Y. M. C. A. third, with 17, and the Milwaukee Athletic club drew 8. One of the largest crowds which has witnessed a meet on Marshall field this spring, attracted by the marathon race as well, saw records smashed right and left, one national and seven Central association marks being broken and one Central mark tied. In addition, the relay mark was lowered.

Chillicothe Cooks a Favorite.
Cook, the Chillicothe "phenom," besides tying with Patterson in the high jump, smashed the Central record in the broad, and attempted to set an A. A. U. record of six feet, one-half inch in the high, but failed.

Ed Parry failed to show in the shot-put, which was won by Dunlap, for the C. A. A., with Osthoff of Milwaukee and Russell, II, of C. second and third. Again a Central record fell. Ed got his revenge, however, in the hammer throw, in which he took first, breaking the Central mark. Thomas and Williamson took the other places.

Leroy Samms, world's champion, won the pole vault at eleven feet eight inches. Jacobs of Central Y. M. C. A., whose work in the Y. M. C. A. meet last Saturday brought him into the limelight, was second, and Iddings and Norris fought for third, the former winning. Samms made one trial for a world's record, twelve feet six and three-eighths inches, but failed.

Maroons Win Relay.

The feature of the Marathon he expected, was the relay, in which the Chicago Athletic association, to the surprise of the Cherry Circle men, lost to the University of Chicago team. Malcomson, who ran first, had a shade the best over Taylor, but the latter cut down the lead at the finish, and Quigley and Blair started almost together. The latter was the speedier, however, and set off his team mate, Bohnsack, with a good lead. Davis of Chicago, a new man, ran an excellent race, but was unable to lessen the gap. Smith started about five yards ahead of Merriam, and for a while it looked good for the Cherry Circle. At the curve, however, Merriam caught and passed his rival, finishing yards to the good with a phenomenal burst of speed. The time, 3:27 3-8, bettered the mark of 3:31 made by the Michigan team at Detroit in 1900.

Conditions Are Favorable.

The track, in spite of the heavy rain, was in perfect condition, and the slight wind on the stretch did not interfere with the work of the runners.

In the second heat of the hundred Blair forced Hahn to equal his own A. A. U. record of 19 seconds flat to win, but in the final heat Marley took second, with Blair a close third.

The Central Y. M. C. A. started to score in the mile. O. W. Mangels of the association set pace for two laps, and then left the lead to Bartlett. Glaze beat Saura for the front place on the back stretch in the last lap in a savage fight, and Timblin of the C. A. A. came up to third.

Victory of Lewis, another C. A. A. athlete, led all the way in the 440. Powell made a desperate effort to catch him, but failed. Bohnsack took an easy third.

Discus Records Go.

The next records to go were the national and central marks in the discus, both of which were bettered by Griffin, who beat out Parry and Dunlap with a put of 128 feet 7 inches. A few moments later Blair, with his teammates, Marley and Irons, scored a slam for the C. A. A. with all three places, breaking another central record.

As was expected, Malcomson won the low hurdles, but Merriam, the university quarter miler, sprung a surprise by finishing only a yard behind the winner, although he never ran the hurdles previous to this. De Tray, U. of C., was third.
