**TRACK TEAM RETURNS FROM  
CULVER HIGHLY ELATED OVER  
RESULT OF MEET.**

## LOST BY SCORE 67 TO 37

**Baseball Team Defeats Niles by  
Close Score of 6 to 5—Meet  
Scheduled With Michigan City  
Saturday Will Be Interesting.**

The high school track team made a showing at Culver Saturday in the outdoor meet. Though defeated, 67 to 37, the locals returned home highly elated over the results of the meet. Before starting they realized that the military academy was far outside of their class but the trip itself together with the experience was ample reward for any unpleasantness or disagreeableness arising from defeat.

The local team won first place in three events. Bastar took first place in the 100 yard dash, 220 yard run and Hubbard easily took the honors in the 440 yard run. The academy boys refused to run the 50 yard dash but awarded Bastar first place, Christopher second and Balcon third. In the 220 yard high hurdles Bastar would have made first place with perfect ease had he not turned his ankle which caused him to fall. He was running on a curve track and while making a curve the accident occurred.

The one salient feature of the meet was the surprise the locals gave the military lads when Bastar made first place in the 100 yard dash, defeating Balcon, the school's crack runner, who beat Harvey Blair of Wabash college. Bastar's running was a marvel to the college athletes.
