

TRACK WORK ON THE CARD

Coach Ryan Will Get Busy With D. U. S. Squad Outdoors This Afternoon.

PLENTY OF WORK FOR ALL SCHOOLS

Weather permitting the D. U. S. track men under Coach Ryan will start outdoor work this afternoon at the Elmwood grounds. The boys are all back from spring vacation feeling fine, and yesterday went through light work in the school gymnasium. Coach Ryan will take the squad out on the track to get them working with spikes. It is a very short time now he will justify cross country running for the purpose of conditioning the athletes.

The field, to the surprise of all, is drying out nicely and will be in the best of condition in two weeks with fair weather. Just as soon as possible a heavy roller will be run over it a few times, which is all that is necessary for the finishing touches.

About the middle of this month Eddie will give his boys a handiicap meet to find out just what material needs most attention. The first real track meet will come on April 21 when the whole squad will be taken to Lansing for a trial meet with the freshmen of M. A. C. This will give Ryan plenty of time to work up promising raw material for the big meet later. For a while early last winter the school's prospects for a winning team looked rather dull but they are picking up rapidly and the announcement that Louis White would return this week gives the squad a good boost. White is good in sprints and the relay and may cut a figure in the broad jump or weight events.

Would Welcome Horner.

What would make the D. U. S. team look very strong would be the confirmation of the rumor that one Horner of Grand Rapids, would attend D. U. S. There is still a strong possibility that the crack Grand Rapids boy will come here and should his merits decide, he would join to Detroit, the dopsters can figure the D. U. S. team as strong point winners in all the events.

On May 15, D. U. S. will go to Cleveland for the annual dual meet with the Cleveland University school. This meet is for a trophy, donated by the two schools, on which the locals have two hosts. A victory this year would give D. U. S. permanent possession of the cup. On Saturday, May 18, is practically the only open date and this has been offered to Central High for a dual meeting, but as Central has that date filled chances for a meeting of the rivals this year are slight. They will meet two or three times during the season, however, which will be a good line on the respective merits.

Saturday, May 25, is the date set for the annual Michigan interscholastic meet at Ann Arbor, in which both D. U. S. and Central High will compete and two weeks after that June 8, Stagg's annual interscholastic meet will be given at Chicago. D. U. S. will be represented in Chicago and it is probable Central will also send a team.
