

**D. U. S BRINGS A GRIEVANCE**

**Cleveland Would Not Decide Relay, in Which Detroit Would Win.**

**MEET IS UNFINISHED. LOCAL SCHOOL LEADS**

D. U. S track team arrived home from Cleveland yesterday morning, anything but satisfied with the way the dual meet between the Cleveland U. S. and the local school was run on Saturday. As it stands now, the winner has yet to be decided. The kick runs from the start of the meet to the finish, but the one big yell is over the relay race, known with terror among the Detroit school team was one-third of a point ahead of their Cleveland rivals when it came up to the relay event to decide the meet.

In this event, Spiegel started for D. U. S. as the first man, and was off with the best start, and while the Cleveland runner failed to start, the result being that Spiegel took a lead of nearly 200 yards. Coach Ryan of Cleveland, then ran across the field and stopped Spiegel. The Cleveland man came up to Spiegel, and stopped, also under his coach's orders. The men walked to the finish, where Spiegel walked up to Judge, the D. U. S. second runner, and the crowd yelled for them to go on. In shouting Page, Spiegel spoke him just above the host, but Page started, as did the second Clevelander, who, with Page crippled, took a big lead, which D. U. S. was unable to overcome.

**Protest is Allowed.**

Coach Ryan, of the Detroit bunch, protested the event, on the action of the Cleveland coach in stopping Spiegel, the protest was accepted, and the Clevelanders started to fight their case in a half hour. After getting into their minds they changed their minds, however, and wanted the Detroit team to stay over until Monday, which they could not do. Coach Ryan wanted the Clevelanders to write the facts to either Murphy or Stage, not wishing to write to Fitzpatrick, who is Ryan's friend, but this is the way the meet stands in Detroit, which D. U. S. would have won easily, as Cleveland had but one good man in the event.

With the Torres mishap out, the Detroit team would have coped easily, as the big boy would have had things all his own way in the high hurdles and long jump. His protest is not to be put off until Saturday's meet. On that day the D. U. S. team will contest with the U. of M. Freshmen team. While the local boys do not figure they have a chance, Ryan believes it will be great practice for the team, and they will go in to beat the Freshmen if possible. This will be the only time this season, giving the followers a chance to see it in action.

**Page is Also Out.**

Page's injury will probably keep this boy out Saturday also, which makes the D. U. S. team look very bad. While they will be much heavier, which means additional strength in the sprints for the local team, as well as in the weight class, in the discus at Cleveland Pickett proved the surprise. He threw the missile 85 feet, the only good throw of the day, but the judge, who was a Cleveland school faculty's man, as were all the others, said he found out and it was not allowed. This would have won the event, and the meet with the Central High track squad has no meet on this week, but Coach Collins will probably give them a tryout meet at the Big Michigan Intercollegiate course the following week, May 24 and 25. To this both Central and D. U. S. will go.
