

ST. JOSEPH WON THE MEET

LOCAL ATHLETES PROVE THEY ARE SUPERIOR TO OPONENTS.

SCORED SEVENTY-FIVE

St. Joseph won the inter-county meet at Niles Saturday afternoon in a walk, with a title of seventy-five points. In only one event did the boys in this city fail to take first place, that was in the running high jump.

There were twelve hundred people when the meet opened at Parker's Driving Park. Ideal weather graced the event and no more favorable conditions could be asked for than existed Saturday.

Dowagiac came in a special car over the Michigan Central and brought one hundred rooters with them. St. Joseph added almost ninety to the crowd and Cassopolis was also well supported.

Perkins from the M. A. C. did all officiating, acting as referee, starter etc. His work was excellent and his decisions were never questioned.

Phillips was the star of the day in the running events, easily taking first place in them all and making excellent time. Fyfe took the one-half mile event in a trot and McLin was another of the big point gainers. These three winning 50 points between them.

The students of the local school will celebrate their victory on their own high school grounds next Wednesday evening. It has been planned to have bon-fire speeches and a general celebration to mark the entrance of this school into athletics again. A mass meeting was held at chapel this morning at which the spirit of the students appeared to be clearly in favor of boosting athletics in the school.

A vast amount of the credit for the success of the meet belongs to Prof. Lee. He handled the whole affair in a most business-like manner.

Pole vault—Fletcher, St. Joseph, first; Kinane, Dowagiac, second; Gibson, Niles, third. Height, 9 ft. 8 inches.

Running broad jump—McLin, St. Joseph, first; Hinkle, Niles, second; Vetter, Niles, third. Distance, 18 ft., 11 inches.

Two hundred twenty yard dash— McLin, St. Joseph, first; Cavanaugh, St. Joseph, second; Hanchett, Niles, third. No time recorded.

High Kick—Moffatt, St. Joseph, first; Chambers, Cassopolis, second; Garwood, Dowagiac, third. Height, 4 ft., 2 inches.

One hundred yard dash—Phillips, St. Joseph, first; Wadsworth, St. Joseph, second; Pullock, Cassopolis, third. Caught in ten seconds flat.

Running high jump—Hamilton, Buchanan, first; Chambers, Cassopolis, second; Mollhagen, St. Joseph, third.

Shot put—Phillips, St. Joseph, first; Morris, Niles, second; Cooper, Niles, third. Distance, 44 feet.

Forty yard dash—Fyfe, St. Joseph, first; Moffatt, St. Joseph, second; Preston, St. Joseph, third. Time 5 35 seconds.

Relay—St. Joseph team, Fyfe, McLin, Wadsworth and Phillips, easily won over four other teams. Dowagiac ran second and Buchanan third.

The schools scored the following on points: St. Joseph, 75; Dowagiac, 21; Niles, 17; Buchanan, 10; Cassopolis, 7.
