
ANN ARBOR SCORES HIGHEST

While Bay City and Jackson Tied for
Seventh Place in Interscholastic
Meet.

Lansing, May 18.—The second annual invitation Central Michigan Interscholastic track and field meet under the management of the Michigan agricultural college was held on the college field this afternoon. Eighteen of the best high schools in the state had teams on the field, backed by large followings.

Ann Arbor had the best balanced team, every man gaining at least two points. They won the meet with a total of 41 points. Olivet college was second with 10 points.

Richards, of Ann Arbor, and Gifford, of Olivet, each secured 10 points for their teams. The records in the pole vault, high jump, broad jump, hammer throw and shot put made last year, were lowered. The feature of the day was the half-mile relay race. Nine teams competed, Ann Arbor winning after a close and exciting finish.

The points made in the several events by different schools are as follows: Ann Arbor, 41; Olivet, 10; Saginaw, 9; Belding, 9; Freeport, 9; Memphis, 6; Bay City, 5; Jackson, 5; Battle Creek, 4; Mason, 3; Charlotte, 3; St. Johns, 3; and Lansing, 1.
