# WON THE MEET

Ann Arbor Got Only as Near  
as Seventh Place for the  
Pennant.

Homer of Grand Rapids Broke  
the Records in the Pole  
Vault and the Shot Put.

The score of the Michigan interscholastic meet at the end stood as follows: Morgan Park Academy, 31; Grand Rapids High, 20½; Detroit Central 28, Lewis Institute 21, Chicago University School 12 2-3; Detroit University School 9, Ann Arbor 8 1-3, Muskegon 6, Lake View 3, North Division 2½, Plymouth 2, Saginaw 1, Benton Harbor 1.

The tenth interscholastic meet is history—and Morgan Park, Chicago, is the victorious school. This morning the finals in all the track events were run off and, because of the cold and the rain which fell after the first event and continued until almost the end, no records were broken. There was a small crowd to see the finals which determined with whom the banner was to go.

The first event was the final 100 yard dash. Mills of Morgan Park came in first. Morton of Chicago University School second, Widman of Detroit Central third, and Bastar of Benton Harbor, fourth. Mills' time was 10 4-5 seconds which is 4-5 seconds slower than Cook's time of last year.

The 120 yard high hurdles were run in 17 1-5 seconds by Craig of Detroit Central, who pulled away from all his competitors. Homer of Grand Rapids was second Torrey of D. U. S. third and Smith of Chicago University School fourth.

The quarter was won by Mills of Morgan Park in 53 4-5 seconds, with Morton of Chicago University School second, Nicholl of Lewis Institute third, and Woodcock of D. U. S. fourth.

The mile went at 4 minutes 44 1-5 seconds to C. Butler of Lewis Institute, Henavon of Detroit Central second, and Lawrence and Nelson of Muskegon third and fourth.

The hammer throw went at only 158 feet 2 inches to Tilly of Morgan Park, in spite of the fact that he threw it 170 feet yesterday in practice. His teammate Watts was second, Homer of Grand Rapids third, and Dick of Muskegon fourth.

Craig of Detroit Central won the low hurdles in 37 2-5 seconds, Homer of Grand Rapids second, Garrels of Detroit Central third, and Morris of Chicago University School fourth.

Mills of Morgan Park took the 220 yard dash in 23 4-5 seconds, Claussness of Lewis Institute second, Widman of Detroit Central third, and Wampler of Chicago University School fourth.

In the two-mile Ann Arbor did just what she did last year—took first and second places. The race through the 7th lap was about even between Ben O'Neil and Henderson of Ann Arbor and Bullock and Gillette of Muskegon. But in the last lap Ben O'Neil pulled away from the other three and by a fine sprint, came in in 11 minutes and 22 2-5 seconds. Henderson, Bullock and Gillette were about even and when it came to the home stretch Henderson, by a great sprint came in ahead of the other two. Gillette would have been second if he had not fallen about eight feet from the tape and as a result Bullock won third and Gillette fourth place.

The half mile relay was the last event and was won by Detroit Central, Chicago University School was second, Lewis Institute third and D. U. S. fourth. Ann Arbor's last man, Cornwall, ran a fine race, but he was unable to gain enough to make up for the losses of his predecessors.

The half mile was run in 2 minutes 5 3-5 seconds by Sullivan of Grand Rapids. Nelson of Muskegon came in second, Hall of D. U. S. third, and Palmer of Morgan Park fourth.

Homer of Grand Rapids was the star of the meet. Yesterday he broke the Michigan interscholastic records in the pole vault and the shot put. He went 11 feet 3 inches into the air on the vault and shoved the weight 50 feet 4 inches.
