

EASY FOR ANN ARBOR

DETROIT CENTRAL IS NO MATCH FOR PURPLE AND WHITE.

Cass Avenue Boys Take First in Four Events—Capt. Garrels Runs Quarter in Remarkable Time, if Watches Were Right.

Ann Arbor, Mich., March 13.—Ann Arbor high school won the dual meet with Detroit Central tonight by a score of 46 1-4 to 30 3-4. There is a slight dispute about the pole vault event. Mitchell broke the pole in going over at 9 feet 8 inches and this smashed up that game, but if Detroit had taken all the points it would not affect the general result. It was decided to split the nine points between the three Detroit men and the Ann Arborites.

The track is supposed to be 20 laps to the mile, but either it is short or the watches were fast as Garrels ran the quarter in 52 1-5 seconds. On such short turns it is simply phenomenal, and he would trim anything in the varsity if the distance and chronometers were correct. Ann Arbor made slams in the half mile, mile and shot.
