

# CORNELL MEET TO DETROITERS

D. U. S. OUTCLASSES ALL RIVAL  
TEAMS ON MUDDY FIELD  
AT ITHACA.

John Spiegel and Ed Hannivan Star  
for Locals, Wining First Each  
Hawkins and Tilley Also Show.

ITHACA, N. Y., May 9.—On a field almost knee deep with mud, which prevented fast time being made, the athletes from the Detroit university school outclassed all other competitors in the Cornell interscholastic track meet today and won with a score of 47 points. Mercersburg academy, the nearest competitor, was second with 40½ points.

Despite the condition of the track, John Spiegel, of Detroit, ran the 100-yard dash in 10 3-5 seconds. He also finished first in the 220-yard dash. Hannivan, of Detroit, also excelled in the half-mile and mile runs, winning both events handily.

Although the Michigan city had a small team in the field the superior condition of the men told and every one finished first in six of the thirteen events, winning the 100 and 220-yard dashes, half-mile and mile runs, the high jump, and the 12-pound hammer throw. Summaries:

100-yard dash—Won by Spiegel, Detroit; time, 10 3-5 seconds.

120-yard high hurdles—Won by Hall, Mercersburg; 16 1-5 seconds.

440-yard dash—Won by Noxon, of Syracuse; time, 53 4-5 seconds.

1/2-mile run—Won by Hannivan, Detroit; time, 4:49 1-5.

Pole vault—Won by Warrendorff, Cornell, 10 feet 8 inches.

Running broad jump—Hall, Mercersburg, 20 feet 11 inches.

12-pound hammer throw—Won by Tilly, Detroit, 153 feet 6 inches.

Two-mile run—Won by Murray, Mercersburg; time, 11:33 3-5.

1/2-mile run—Hannivan, Detroit; time, 2:08 3-4.

High jump—Hawkins, Detroit, 5 feet 3 3/4 inches.

220 yards low hurdles—Won by Hall, Mercersburg; time, 16 1-5 seconds.

220-yard dash—Won by Spiegel, Detroit; time, 23 1-5 seconds.

Shot put—Won by White, Mercersburg, 44 feet 6 inches.
