D. U. S. OUTCLASSES ALL RIVAL TEAMS ON MUDDY FIELD AT ITHACA.

DN 5-10-1908 John Spiegel and Ed Hannivan Star for Locals, Wining First Rach's Hawkins and Tilley Also Show.

[HPECIAL TO THE NEWS THIBUNE.] ITHACA, N. Y., May 9.—On a field almost 'man deep with mud, which prevented fast time being made, the athletes from the Detroit university school outclassed all other competi-

tors in the Cornell interscholastic track meet today and won with a score of 47 points. Mercersburg academy, the nearest competitor, was second with 4014 points.

Despite the condition of the track, John Spiegel, of Detroit, ran the 100-yard dasa in 103-5 seconds. He also finished first in the 220-yard dash. Hannivan, of Detroit, also excalled in the half-mile and mile runs, winning both events handly,

Although the Michigan dity had a small team in the field the superior condition of the men told and every one finished first in six of the thirteen events, winning the 100 and 220-yard dashes, half-mile and mile runs, the high jump, and the 12-pound hammer throw. Summaries:
