

# MUSKEGON LOSES TO CENTRAL HIGH

NINE POINTS SEPARATES LEADING TEAMS IN CENTRAL MICHIGAN MEET.

"Scotty" Smith Loses Out to Sullivan in Half; Widman Wins 220-Yards Dash.

LANSING, Mich., May 16.—The third annual Central Michigan inter-scholastic track meet held here today was won by Detroit Central High school by nine points over Muskegon, the nearest competitor, while Ann Arbor got third. The meet was the most successful yet held, an ideal day, good track and keen rivalry were the chief factors in making it a success.

There were about 300 contestants representing 30 schools of Michigan and bringing the best prep. school material of the state together. Ten records of the Central Michigan inter-scholastic were broken and some of these are higher than the Ann Arbor inter-scholastic. Shaw, of Muskegon, pole vaulted 10 feet 11 inches, while Kohler, of Lansing, threw the hammer 161 feet. The summaries:
