The first place in the meet went, as was expected, to Detroit Central, although if Muskegon had had a little turn of luck, the City of the Straits men would have had to have been careful of their lattrels. The Detroiters won 29 points, Muskegon 20½, while Ann Arbor finished third with 11. Grand Rapids came sixth in the list, with seven points and was tied at that by Big Rapids. The first medal place that Muskegon won came in the pole vault event when George Shaw broke the records by clearing the bar at 11 feet, one inch. Shaw's work was the sensation of the day and it was responsible for Muskegon's fine showing in the meet.
