

**FOURTEEN SCHOOLS
ENTER U. OF M. MEET**

**Two More Looked for—Warm
Fight Expected for Vic-
tory This Year.**

Ann Arbor, Mich., 20.—With fourteen prep schools officially entered and two more tentatively signifying their desire to enter the University of Michigan's eleventh annual interscholastic meet to be held here Friday and Saturday of this week, this year's sports carnival promises to eclipse any of the half-score that have preceded it. Oak Park and North Division of Chicago are the only two schools which have not yet notified Manager Whiting how many men they would place in the big event. Both, however, have written of their intentions to come.

Five interscholastic records went by the board at Urbana last Saturday and Oak Park won with 15 points. That's part of the dope that Michigan schools are just now pondering upon.

Now to make the predictions more difficult Lake Forest say they are going to win the meet with 8 or 9 men and to back up their assertion point to the record at Lake Forest last Saturday when they won the meet with 24 1-2 points. Alderman, their formidable weight man, threw the discus 151 feet, 3 inches, breaking the Lake Forest school record and putting the plate nearly 15 feet beyond the Michigan interscholastic record of 199 feet, 10 1-4 inches, now held by Strelinger of M. M. A.

About the Local Teams.

Saturday at the central Michigan meet at M. M. A. saw Detroit Central grab the laurels and should be a strong contender. Central will use about a dozen athletes in the 12 events. D. U. S. comes with 10 men, entering everything but the two mile. M. M. A. is sending three men. Ann Arbor also expects to place well up in the meet with its 18. Ben Oille is the varsity city's star. Monday he chased the university novice racers over four and one-half miles and finished well ahead of the college winner. The D. U. S. will be greatly handicapped by the absence of three of their stars, notably Mills and Tilley, both of whom are said to be over the age limit, 21 years.

Although all schools were supposed to have their entries in by last Friday an extension of time has been granted and entries will be allowed up to the last moment. Up to date these are the schools, number of men and events that each school has entered: Ann Arbor, 18, every event; Bay City, East Side, 9, everything except two-mile and pole vault; D. U. S., 10, everything except two-mile; Grand Rapids, 20, everything; Hyde Park, 2, dashes, hurdles and jumps; Lansing, 2, dashes, broad jump, hammer throw, discus and shot put; Muskegon, 12, everything except 220 and relay; M. M. A., 8, 220, high jump, broad jump, mile, pole vault, hammer throw, shot put and discus; St. Joe, 1, dashes, and 440; Saginaw, 7, dashes, 440, mile, 120, high hurdles, high jump, discus and relay; Shelby, 5, dashes, 440, half-mile, 220, low hurdles, hammer throw, shot put, broad jump, discus and relay; West-gell Phillips, 15, dashes, pole vault and broad jump; Central, 24, everything; North Division, Oak Park and Lake Forest have not yet handed in entries.
