CENTRAL HIGH AGAIN WINNER

Judge did not have the heart to disqualify, inasmuch as neither school stood to win the prize. They called it a tie, and a moment later Henderson proved his right to the great place by winning the toss for the medal. McLain, of Ann Arbor, finished third and Olliste, of Milwaukee, fourth.

The students high and low were both soft for Capt. Allen Garretts, of Central. In the two hurdles J. Spiegel was his chief opponent and Coach Ed. Lehndorf, of Ann Arbor, got the third and Schaefer, of Milwaukee, fourth. In the third hurdle, Schaefer was the lad to follow Garretts over the tape. In 18 4-8 seconds, Allen never was in danger of losing.

Fights by Detroiters.

As was expected from start to finish it was a fight between D. U. S. and Central for the main prize, J. Spigel, the first D. U. S. runner, only to have Spigam, the second runner, not only lose this lead but five yards more. Then Garretts, running against him, won. In the final, get the finishers. Ann Arbor scored third place and Milwaukee fourth, there being but four teams in the contest.

High Park, with five, scored the greatest number of firsts with D. U. S. second, counting four and Detroit Central and Milwaukee tied for third with three, leaving the region's tie in the two-mile race. Coach Garretts' team scored first in all with Central second, eight and D. U. S. third with seven. This it shows how well balanced Central is, while Milwaukee, though better balanced, was yet to obtain the class to top five of which were being four places.

In the summation, which appeared in Saturday's Free Press, Morrison, of Hyde Park, was credited with second place in the pole vault going to Boston, of M. M. A., with Bonaventura, scored 211 points for the soldier school. The Lake Forest academy, entering at four miles, and all four brought home second points, and can be figured on second honors at Slugg's meet two weeks hence, when the Chicagoans will have a larger entry list.

500-yard hurdles—Garretts (Central) won, J. Spigel (D. U. S.) second, Lake Forest (Ann Arbor), third, Spigel (Central), fourth, time 2:28 seconds.

Eight-hurdle mile—Central finished James Spigel and William, won in 12:15, J. Spigel, Spigel, Spigel and J. Spigel, second, Ann Arbor, high third, and Milwaukee, high fourth, time 22:15.
