

## D. U. S. ATHLETES EASY WINNERS

### Northwestern Track Meet First Honors Go to Detroiters With 37 1-3 Score.

#### HANNEVAN WINS MILE, ESTABLISHING A RECORD

#### D. U. S. Sprinters Also Smash Relay Race Mark—Mills and Speigel Boys Star.

Chicago, May 20.—Detroit University school, previous winner of the inter-scholastic at Cornell, added to its laurels today at Evanston by taking the inter-scholastic given by Northwestern university. Detroit had a total of 37 1-3 points; Oak Park high school, which the week before had won the Illinois inter-scholastic at Champaign, was far from a close second with 25 points. Lake Forest, with 15 points, was the third, and Morgan Park was fourth with 12.

Mills in the sprints, Hannevan in the mile and the half-mile runs, the two Speigels in the dashes and hurdles and Tilley in the hammer and discus were the men that chalked up points for the Wolverines.

It was a gala day for smashing records, no less than nine new records going to the wall. Hannevan, of Detroit, made a record in the mile of 4:38 2-5. In the quarter mile, Martin, of Oak Park, set a new mark of :32, a reduction of two-fifths of a second. In the low hurdles J. Speigel, of Detroit, set a record of :26 2-5, a reduction of two-fifths seconds. In the half mile Percival, of Lake Forest, made a record of 2:03, lowering the old one one second even.

#### D. U. S. Breaks Relay Record.

In the half mile relay the Wolverines set a record of 1:34 4-5, bringing down the old one two and three-fifths seconds.

The record of every weight event was made over again. In the hammer throw and shot put Prather set new marks. In the former adding 12 feet and 8 inches to the previous record of 152 feet. In the shot put he added one inch for a total of 43 feet 1 inch.

The mile run, in which Hannevan, of Detroit University school, clipped one and two-fifths seconds from the local inter-scholastic record, was a fine exhibition of speed and endurance. In the first lap Hannevan was near the end of the procession. At the end of the second he had advanced to fourth place. Before the end of the third lap he had assumed the lead, and on the final circuit he sprinted the entire distance as if he were just starting. He finished fifteen yards in front of Marks, the Beloit high school crack miler.
